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Dr. Nerlinger has experience in legislative and community advocacy, specifically in the areas of pediatric environmental health and health care finance. She sits on the Executive Committee of the American Academy of Pediatrics Council on Environmental Health. Her current research focuses on health system-community partnerships, specifically measuring health and economic outcomes associated with medical-legal partnerships (MLPs). Through her role on the Advisory Committee of Delaware First Lady Tracey Quillen Carney's First Chance Delaware: Legal Services as Prevention initiative, Dr. Nerlinger is overseeing the creation, implementation, and evaluation of the first pediatric-focused medical-legal partnership in the State of Delaware. She is lead co-author of the article "The Advocacy Portfolio: A Standardized Tool for Documenting Physician Advocacy" published in *Academic Medicine*.
