CALIFORNIA HOMEMAKERS ASSOCIATION (CHA) is a free and voluntary, unincorporated, private membership association of in-home care, domestic, service and other low-paid workers. CHA fights to alleviate the problem of low pay, unemployment, rising costs of food, clothing, utilities and other necessities that plague our low-paid domestic worker members.

At CHA, members help members to organize a self-help, eleven-point benefit program that includes emergency food, clothing, preventive medical care, non-emergency dental care, legal assistance and a job board to meet day-to-day survival needs of domestic and other low-paid worker members and their families, while fighting to change the economic policies that cause these conditions.

Volunteers are needed now to help with canvassing house to house in low-income neighborhoods to locate those in need of assistance and organization, offering membership in the association. Donations of food, new toys, and other items for holiday distributions to members enrolled in a year-round budget-saving benefit program are urgently needed, as well as volunteer drivers, phoners, canvassers, sorters and packers. The only criteria for participation is the willingness to learn the organizing method that has built the most successful movement for lasting change and advancement for unrecognized labor in the country. All organizational activity is made possible entirely by community support and volunteer assistance, so that no ulterior motive is served.
