





Charles Wesley



December 18, 2022, marks the 315th anniversary of the birth of the beloved hymn writer, **Charles Wesley**. He was born in 1707 at Epworth, Lincolnshire, England and died March 29, 1788 in London. Charles was an English clergyman, poet, who, with his elder brother John, started the Methodist movement in the Church of England.

He published more than 4,500 hymns and left some 3,000 in manuscript. Famous composer, George Frederic Handel wrote music specifically for some of these hymns. Among Wesley's best-known hymns are "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling," "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing," "Christ the Lord Is Ris'n Today," "Soldiers of Christ, Arise," "Rejoice, the Lord Is King," and "Jesu, Lover of My Soul." Many of Wesley's hymns transcend denominational hymnody and appear in hymnals of virtually all protestant churches.

Today's Lessons and Carols service was based on text from "Hark! The Herald Angels sing. They text is based on Luke 2:8-14, the portion of the Christmas story where the angels appear to the Shepherds. It first appeared in the Wesley Hymnal *Hymns and Sacred Poems*, in 1739 and was originally composed as ten verses under the title, "Hymn for Christmas Day." The version we sing today is not Wesley's original text. It has been altered many times by many editors. The most significant alteration was by George Whitfield in 1753 when he changed the first line from "Hark how all the welkin rings!" to "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing!" Welkin means sky; vault of heaven and is not common in today's vernacular. The most common tune for this hymn is MENDELSSOHN, but earlier versions paired the text with EASTER HYMN (Christ the Lord is risen today). This Christmas Carol is one of the most known and cherished around the world.
