April 25th was also proclaimed Carter Bonas Day in the City of Lauderhill, for how Carter is bringing awareness to Autism and encouraging those living with the diagnosis. The golf tournament is a fundraiser to support organizations dedicated to helping those with Autism.

Carter will be holding an Autism Sensory Demonstration on the Putting Green, to help you experience what it can be like for Autistic Golfers to play the game. Golfers and the MEDIA are invited to participate, as well as, interview Carter and participants supporting this incredible cause.

Carter says, "I want to help encourage and motivate people like me. I want them to know that there's life after their diagnosis, that they can go after their dream." "My tournament is an opportunity for people in the community to come together and support my mission, to tell people like me and those with other disabilities that they are important, that they matter."
