In February we will host the Secret Sister Tea, which includes all women of the Congregation. In March we will once again begin to assemble Blessing Bags


## Bible Studies at Christ Church

# THE AMERICAN DREAM...AT CHRIST CHURCH Sue Koch





In early 1985, the Tran family of 6 piled into a small boat made by the Tran family and other escaping Vietnamese families and sailed the dangerous waters from Vietnam to the Philippines. Once in the Philippines, the Tran family made contact with the ELCA.

The ELCA (along with other Christian organizations) vetted the escapees. Then, the ELCA sought to place these families with churches in the USA willing to sponsor them. The commitment of churches was to provide housing, completely furnish the apartment, providing all the necessities, enroll the children in school, and find work for the husband. The receiving church committed to cover living expenses and necessities (including healthcare) for 6 months.

Christ Church (nee Lutheran Ministry in Christ) committed to adopt the Tran family from Vietnam. The Tran family arrived at Ft. Lauderdale airport at midnight, speaking no English, with a modest box labeled "Tran Family"...all their belongings. Fortunately, an LMIC member was a Vietnamese woman; we had communication! The apprehension on the faces of the little ones will never be forgotten.

The outpouring of love by the entire congregation was overwhelming. The mother spoke very, very little English; she walked thru her new apartment home touching the furniture saying '...mine?'. This modest apartment was the mansion of their dreams. Yes, their American Dream.

Nancy Walter (a now deceased but active long-time member) and I were the coordinators of the church's efforts with the Tran family; we were the familiar faces. But many other members were actively involved. Nancy was a 'hugger'; she and others got their hugging fix after church every Sunday.

Very quickly, the Tran's wanted to be independent and not rely on the church. We found the father a job; the wife was a seamstress and quickly found work. The children adjusted quickly; the oldest daughter Hang learned English and helped with translation for her parents.

A few years later, the Tran's connected with family and friends in Southern California. After lots of tears, they moved to the Orange County area. We heard from them periodically. About 8 years ago, we received a beautiful book Victoria (formerly daughter Dam) had assembled for us. We cried and made immediate contact. For the past 5 years, we spend a day with the entire Tran family when Allan and I visit Southern California at T-Giving.

The children were age 2, 4, 6, 8 when they arrived. The youngest was killed in an unfortunate auto accident at age 19 in Southern California. The 3 kids are married with children. They own their own homes in expensive Southern California; plus, they collectively look after their parents. The attached picture was taken at the beautiful home of Nick (formerly Bac) this past November. Spending time with them is a highlight of our travels to California.

The Tran family, all of them, always ask about 'our church'. We thought Christ Church deserved an update. Who doesn't like a real life story...the American Dream
