A. A 1 percent sales tax that must be approved by voters and must be used for specific projects. This sales tax that is spent within our County stays in our County. People that don’t live here that come shop and/or dine also pay the 1 percent tax and that too stays in our County.

McIntosh Parkway

This project is the construction of a parkway that will connect Newnan Crossing Bypass to Greison Trail. This will alleviate much of the traffic that is now on Lower Fayetteville Road. Grant funds have been awarded through the SRTA GTIB. The funding source is the Grant, SPLOST 2007, SPLOST 2013 and Impact Fees. The construction is **UNDERWAY!** Anticipated completion; early 2019.

Dog Park:

A contract has been awarded for the design of a dog park utilizing the Harper's Farm property located on Sprayberry Road. The park will also include a small passive playground. Staff has 2 concepts that will be presented to Council for review. After the design has been approved, the construction documents will be complete.


LMIG 2017 and LMIG 2018:

The LMIG 2017 paving program is near completion. The LMIG 2018 paving program contract has been awarded to Piedmont Paving. The work is scheduled to begin in January of 2018. Funding for these projects are the LMIG program through GDOT and SPLOST 2013 as matching funds.

LINC Phase I:

The City is currently in an agreement with the PATH Foundation to design construction documents for Phase I of the LINC. Design is getting close to completion. East Side Community Park:

The goal of this project is to purchase land (25+ acres) to use as an active park east side of Newnan. However, the City has recently been donated a stretch of land on Newnan Crossing Blvd East. Staff is currently looking to study the feasibility of this location. The current funding will be put towards the new linear park project. As additional impact fee funds become available the City will look forward to making this park a reality.

Fire Station #4:

Architectural design contract was awarded to Goodwyn Mills and Cawood. The City is looking to have a design that brings the traditional “FIRE HOUSE” look back to Newnan as seen in the elevation below. Staff is currently drafting an RFP to let for construction in February 2018. This facility will be located off Millard Farmer Industrial Blvd and the plan is to have it fully staffed and operational in 2019. The funding will be SPLOST 2013 & Impact Fees.
