Village Fields was established, with support from Lane County and the City of Springfield, to provide temporary emergency shelter and services to families and individuals who experience an intellectual or developmental disability. VillageFields currently has 5 family units with the capacity to add 10 additional units for singles if approved by the City of Springfield.

Residents on this property are required to follow a set of community rules designed to make the property a safe, sanitary, and peaceful place for shelter.

Prohibited activities that are not permitted at any time on this property include:

1. Unauthorized guests are not permitted on the property
2. Bringing, having, or using weapons is not permitted on the property
3. Bringing, having or using drugs, alcohol, or drug paraphernalia is not permitted on the property

Services offered at this site

- Support in meeting basic needs of residents, primarily through connecting to resources available in the community.
- Referrals to medical, substance abuse treatment, and social services
- Housing case management services to assist resident in meeting their permanent housing goals.

Services and site operations on this site are funded by a HUD Emergency Shelter grant through Lane County Health and Human Services. Services are offered but it is not mandatory for residents to accept the services offered.

To obtain housing at this site

In order to be eligible for shelter at Village Fields the household must currently be homeless. Participants for the Village Fields program are referred through the Lane County Shelter Site Coordinated Entry System.
