Orinda Union School District is thrilled to introduce Dr. Carrie Nerheim, our new Director of Student Services. Jennifer Woodman, the current OUSD Director of Student Services, is retiring after five years of outstanding service. Dr. Nerheim begins her new position on July 1, and she is excited to get started. Teaching runs in her family. She is a third generation teacher who is following in the footsteps of her mother, a teacher of developmentally disabled adults for 40 years, and her father, a continuation high school teacher for 20 years. Most recently Dr. Nerheim served as the Director of Student Services for Albany Unified, and she is eager to learn and grow with the team here in Orinda.

Dr. Nerheim grew up in Stockton, California, where she attended public schools in both Stockton and Lodi Unified School Districts. She had the unique experience of spending her fourth grade year in a two room school house on King Island. Following graduation from high school, she attended San Joaquin Delta College and after two years, she transferred to the University of California, Los Angeles, where she earned her B.A. in English. She later received her teaching credential from Chapman College, Monterey, and completed part of her student teaching at Fort Ord when it was still an active military base. She earned her Master's Degree in Educational Leadership and Administrative Credential from St. Mary's College, and on June 10th, 2018, she earned her Doctorate in Educational Leadership for Social Justice from California State University, East Bay.

When asked what she most looks forward to about working in OUSD, Dr. Nerheim stated that she can't wait to learn and collaborate interdependently with teachers, instructional assistants, principals, parents, direct service providers, and our SELPA

partners to continue to provide an exceptional educational experience for every student. She is eager to be a support for our students, their families, and our staff.
