

Curriculum Update

Update on Distance Learning

Orinda USD continues to collect feedback and data from our stakeholders regarding their distance learning experiences. This month we focused on students and have used a variety of ways to engage their voices:

- Surveys that measure students' experiences and engagement levels
- Focus groups of students in grades K-5 and 6-8
- Visiting teachers' live Zoom sessions with students

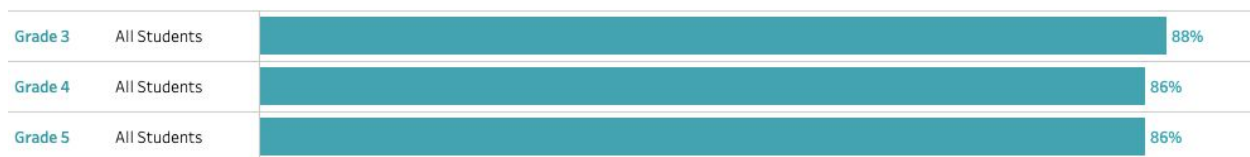
We continue to receive survey responses from students (more than 400 third-fifth graders so far). Initial analysis of the survey data reveals the following trends:

- More than 85% of the respondents in grades 3-5 gave strong marks for their caring relationships at school.

Caring Relationships with School Adults

- Elementary students are reporting high levels of sleep and of regular exercise.
- Elementary and middle school student focus groups shared the value of live online sessions with teachers and their desire to maintain social connections with their teacher(s) and peers.
- Teachers reported a high level of students (>90%) who are regularly engaging with distance learning.
- Many students reported their experience of fatigue with distance learning in the last few weeks of school.
