PASTOR

Welcome to 2021, Atonement! For our first newsletter of the new year, your pastors would like to thank you for your support of and sharing in our congregation's mission and ministry over a very, very challenging 2020.

We wish that we could promise a speedy return to something that resembles normal this year, but we don't know when, or if that will happen. What we do know is that God is with us and our congregation starts a new calendar year in a very good position to follow our mission in 2021.

Thanks to your generosity and the Council's careful management of expenses, we are in a strong financial position. *We also maintained our commitment to give generously to our neighbors and partners in ministry around the world.* Thanks to the hard work and creativity of our staff and volunteers, we have continued to worship and serve our God and our neighbors. We've done this in our building, online, and in the community. Two great examples are

- ❖ *The covid-safe Christmas Eve services at the Park Event Center that allowed us to welcome people from inside and outside of our congregation for a safe evening of worship; and*
- ❖ *A tutoring program started by members of our partner congregation, City of Grace, supported by the United Way and St. Cloud Schools, for children and families to get support during distance learning in our building!*

The pandemic may not be finished, but neither are we! God is at work among us and through us and will never leave us.

As we enter into 2021, we ask you to consider how you can join in your congregation's work, now and in the future. We have opportunities for volunteers to serve in person (we will need additional help in the sanctuary as we start livestreaming) and from home, any day of the week and in any of our ministries.

We're willing to experiment. If you have an idea, your pastors want to help you give it a try and we won't be upset if it fails. In fact, some of our best stuff is born in the crucible of failure! The riskiest thing we can do is nothing.

*Hint - Here's an easy experiment: invite someone to worship with you, or to watch our online service at home and then talk to you about it.*

### **A Word on Our Life Together in Times of Political Turmoil.**

Over the coming days, weeks, and months, America's legal and legislative systems will investigate the insurrection that occurred at our nation's capital on January 6, 2021. The investigation will surely come to some determinations about the facts of that day, what led to its events, and what changes and/or consequences shall be its legacy. We expect these to be consequential and probably controversial. As all of these things unfold, we invite you to remember the 8th commandment: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor" and Martin Luther's explanation thereof: that "We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light." (Luther, "Small Catechism: The Eighth Commandment", ELW, p. 1161).

This may prove hard to do. It is easier to give the benefit of the doubt to someone with whom we agree, or whom we want to believe, than to someone who challenges or disagrees with us. But in our congregations, as in our families and communities, we hold a variety of opinions and commitments. It is your pastors' hope that we will keep our shared commitment to Christ and the truth and mercy He brings first and foremost.

If you wish to have a conversation with one of us about how to apply the 8th commandment in our lives today, we would welcome a phone call, email, or physically-distanced visit with you.



## Chalking the Door at Epiphany

This year Atonement celebrated Epiphany on January 6<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> during worship. (The actual date of Epiphany is always January 6<sup>th</sup>), It is a time to gather with family and friends (**C** is for "community") at the main entrances to homes or apartments (nursing home quarters, extended care facility, or hospital rooms!, etc.), and ask God's blessing on dwellings and on all who live or visit there.

Leadership may be shared with a change of voice at each Leader's part (**L**).

**L:** Peace be to this house and to all who enter here.

**L:** A reading from Proverbs 24:3-4: *"By wisdom a house is built, and through understanding it is established; through knowledge its rooms are filled with rare and beautiful treasures."*

**L:** Let us pray: Gracious God, as a shining star once guided the magi to the birthplace of the infant Jesus, so enable those who dwell here to be your light in the world; through Jesus Christ we pray.

**C:** Amen.

Using chalk (hence, "Chalking the Door"), people are invited to inscribe the lintel of the home (the horizontal frame above the door) with the inscription shown below. The letters C M B come from the traditional (9th century) names for the "three kings" -- Caspar, Melchior & Balthazar. Some also suggest "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means "May Christ bless this dwelling!" Each person is given a turn to make one or more of the marks:

**20 + C + M + B + 21**

**L:** A reading from Isaiah 32:17-18: *"The effect of righteousness is peace and the result of righteousness, quietness and trust forever. My people will abide in a peaceful habitation, in secure dwellings, and quiet places."*

**M:** Let us pray: Sovereign God, we pray that you will bless this home and all who live here with your gracious presence, that your love may be our inspiration, your wisdom our guide, your truth our light, and your peace our benediction; through Jesus Christ we pray.

**C:** Amen.

**L:** Lord, remember your children and teach us to pray:

**C:** Our Father... (People may make the sign of the cross in remembrance of their baptism)

**L:** May the Lord watch + over our going out and our coming in, from this time forth and forevermore.



## Spirit Trek Community Projects

Each month Spirit Trek students grades 6 – 9 do a community project at Atonement on the third Wednesday of the month. For the month of January they will be putting together kits for the homeless. These kits will include personal care items, hand and feet warmers. We want to do 50 kits but depends on funding. The kits cost about \$15 per kit. Hats, gloves and socks will be purchased and also given to *Homeless to Homeless* shelters to be given out as needed, those will not be going into the kits. The cost for the hats, gloves and socks is roughly around \$350. If you would like to help with the cost of putting these together and providing hats, gloves, and socks, please make out a check to Atonement and on the memo line "Homeless Kits."



This year the students have filled 80 birthday bags which were given to Catholic Charities who then give to families so kids can have a cake, with frosting, candles, plates, napkins and a small gift. The bags were made by women of the two quilting groups. By having a cloth bag kids will have something that will remind them that they are cared about. One hundred and fifty bags (150) Blizzard bags were filled in November. These bags are given to Home Delivered Meals so that if meals can't be delivered due to bad weather, the people will have a meal. Each bag consists of a can of soup, tuna or ham salad kits, fruit, juice, cookie and crackers. For December they rang bells for Salvation Army at different sites around St Cloud.
