Message from Pastor

Your pastors feel very lucky to be serving here at Atonement. We like each other. We like the other folks on staff. And we like you, the members of our congregation. We also feel very grateful for the generosity of this congregation, year after year. This is a remarkable blessing. Atonement has had its ups and downs, but your pastors feel nothing but hope for the future here and your generosity is a big part of that hope.

As we begin a new stewardship campaign this Lent (another of our blessings is an excellent stewardship team, again led by Jason Anhorn), we would like to share 3 facts and ask one question.

The first fact is that the majority of our giving households and giving dollars come from senior citizens. This is normal. Older folks, on average, have had a longer time to gather resources, invest, and pay down debt. Most (not all) are done paying for daycare, braces, college and the other costs of raising children. But there are also significant costs that come as we age, so we are deeply grateful for the sacrificial giving that so many of our mature members practice. Thank you.

The second fact is that Atonement has young givers. Not every congregation can say that. We have young singles and young families who may give less than \$100 per year up to multiple \$1,000's per year. We are grateful for each of these people and their generosity, because every gift is significant and, based on the conversations we've had with young givers, is a trade off with other expenses. Health insurance, diapers, clothes, education (Pr Tim has two kids in college this year, and knows that some of you do as well; Pr John is coaching his grade school kids to become nurses, welders, plumbers, or electricians - reasonable training costs, good pay, interesting work) all get more expensive each year, but our young givers have chosen to use some of what God has given them to support the mission of their congregation. Thank you.

The third and final fact we want to share is that giving is good for us. Money is a harsh and loveless master. We heard once that as he lay dying John Rockefeller was asked how much money is enough, and he replied "Just a little bit more." Money is a master who will never be satisfied, but our God is endlessly loving and giving and opens our eyes to see that no matter what we have, we have not just enough, but enough to share. If you can give your money away, it cannot own you. And that is a good thing.

With those things in mind, we ask that you consider this one question as you think about how you and your household will respond to this year's stewardship appeal: **Do you make decisions about how you will use your money, or does your money make decisions about how it will use you?**



We think that a lot of people let their money, and their worries about money, control them and make their decisions. And this is understandable - the story we hear in the wider world is that there are never enough resources to go around, so we have to get and hold on to as much as we can. But we believe, and we have found in our own lives, that when we choose to use our money to live out our values and beliefs, there is enough, and enough to share. Giving is one of the ways your pastors, and the majority of people in this congregation, use our money to live out our values. We are grateful for this generosity and for the ministry that we and God accomplish with those gifts. And we look forward to another year of growing in faith and generosity with you.



Lent 2020 – God Is Near You NOW

Lent is a time of listening ... We listen to the story of Jesus. We listen to Jesus' life. We listen to each other. We listen to ourselves and listen to the world around us.

Listening together during Lent by dwelling in the Word and in the world (through the sharing of our own stories) helps us begin to name what God might be up to in our midst. Listening to stories about what we long for and what we've lost (or are afraid to lose) helps our hearts align with what God cares about most.


MARCH MINISTRY OF THE MONTH


LOOKING AHEAD-FIRST COMMUNION


