Jordan grew up in the handbell world, literally. While his mother Jackie was pregnant, Jordan was in her womb kicking along to the beat during her handbell choirs rehearsals and performances. Once born he was instantly surrounded by the handbell family consisting of 16 mothers and grandmothers as she continued to bring him along to her handbell rehearsals. Having been bonked

on the head by the director more than once as he conducted "his choir" he finally started his ringing career in 2nd grade under the direction of Vickie Helm of The Bells of St. Johns, Park Rapids. Never looking back Jordan has had a very successful career on both sides of the table as both a ringer as well as a conductor. Jordan has had the opportunity to work with choirs in 3 states in religious, community, and educational settings. His last position was Director of Handbell Choirs for Princeton Theological Seminary/Princeton University in Princeton, New Jersey.

Jordan is currently the General Manager of Timberlake Hotel and Timbers Restaurant & Event Center in Staples. He resides in Staples with his husband, Robert who is the Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Moorhead, MN. When not working on various boards and committees Jordan can be found with his hands in the dirt at the Central Lakes College Community Gardens where he grows award-winning dahlias or tending to his flock of egg laying chickens. As a musician, Jordan is active with the Handbell Musicians of Amer-

ica and serves as a substitute organist, pianist, and substitute handbell conductor and ringer for various churches in the region.

# **Confirmation/Youth Ministry**

Yep, this is going to be a weird year! For the confirmation aged youth, 6th-9th grade, Pastor Tim & Pastor John would like them to work on Monthly Milestones with their families. To supplement this the Pastors will invite the confirmation aged youth to connect via Zoom periodically on Wednesdays after worship at 7:15 p.m. and to participate on a once a month in-person get together that will follow the Covid-19 social distancing guidelines in effect at the time. More specific information will be sent out in a letter to each family.

There are 8 Monthly Milestone topics that can be done as a family. Confirmation aged youth will be invited to work on each topic for a month (4-5 weeks in a row) with their family. When the tasks for each topic are completed, students will be invited to sign up for a Sunday to celebrate in worship either live or virtually. An outline and overview of the topics/ projects follows:



- 1. Faith 5 Do this as a family 3x/week Share, Read, Talk, Pray, Bless
- 2. Worship What is worship and how do we share in it.
- 3. **Prayer** Pray every day, learn new ways to pray, write prayers for worship.
- 4. Christmas Story Read the stories of Jesus' birth in the gospels and make a nativity scene out of toys or household items.
- 5. Bible A survey of the bible and the stories that feature kids.
- 6. Communion Make some bread, drink some grape juice/wine and learn the story of how Jesus feeds us and builds us up from the inside with his own body.
- 7. Easter Story How do the gospels tell the Easter story? How will you tell it in a peep diorama?
- 8. Baptism What is baptism? What does it mean? Who are your godparents?

# Children's Ministry



This fall brings significant challenges for faith formation of children in preschool through 5th grade. We have learned that Atonement families cover the entire spectrum when it comes to what they consider safe and appropriate for their children's faith formation. Some prefer to begin the year learning at home. Others are ready to resume in-person Sunday School. Still others would prefer the opportunity to move between those models as the year unfolds.

In order to provide families the greatest range of options, we are offering three different approaches to children's faith formation. Families can choose to participate in any or all of the following three offerings.

1. Pen Pals - One of our Children's ministry households found pen pals for their children over the pandemic summer. We found out about this great idea from the pen pals, who thought it was so rewarding that they told their friends. Your pastors love this idea and think it's a great thing to scale. We have almost 20 adult volunteers already and will keep recruiting more until every child who wants has a pen pal who is a mature, faithful Christian from Atonement.



2. Monthly Milestones - Your pastors and a team of volunteers from the congregation have put together a year's worth of family-centered projects that will guide children and parents (or grandparents, godparents, aunts & uncles) through key elements of the faith. At the end of each project chil-



dren are invited to share their work (for example, learn the Christmas story and build your own Nativity) or learning with the congregation via social media and/or in worship and be celebrated. The "Monthly Milestone" list/instructions will be posted to our website and social media for download.

3. **Sunday School -** This year we will use a curriculum designed for home-based online use so that families can transition between online and in-person learning as the pandemic dictates.

- All Sunday school families will use the same curriculum, which will be linked on our website. This curriculum follows the readings from worship and includes downloadable/printable content and a video. This curriculum allows home-based and in-person Sunday school households to learn the same stories at the same pace and to benefit from a connection to our congregation's worship.
- In-person classes will follow CDC/MDH guidelines concerning masks, distance, contact tracing, etc.
   If we cannot follow guidelines, we will suspend in person gatherings until our leadership feels that we have made the necessary changes to resume.

   These measures are not ideal, but they are for the sake of our children and teachers, each of whom is precious.



Due to the particular dangers posed by the pandemic to older and immune compromised adults, we have a reduced number of teachers available and will only offer in-person classes for grades Pre-k through 5 on Sundays. We hope to resume Wednesday School in the future. If you are able and willing to join the teaching rotation, please notify the pastors, the church office, or the children's ministry team.

# **Back to School Blessing**

We know that back to school is an exciting time, even in a pandemic, and your congregation wants to bless and support students, parents, and school staff. We also know that some families are not ready to come to worship or to the church building for an in-person blessing. Therefore, if you wish for a back to school blessing for your child, your school-worker

spouse, or yourself, you have three options this year. They are:

- 1. Schedule a day to come for a blessing in worship. This can be a Sunday or Wednesday. We ask for scheduling only in order to ensure that we can preserve social distance in worship per our guidelines.
- 2. Schedule a day to come to the office for a socially distanced blessing from one of the pastors.



3. Use the attached blessing (written and shared by a colleague of your pastors serving in Ohio) to bless your family member(s) at home.

Your pastors get kind of emotional thinking about how lucky we are to serve God and neighbor with you. We are deeply grateful for you and for what God has done for and through all of us here at Atonement Lutheran Church. We have not merely weathered a global pandemic, but have remained committed to each other, to our neighbors, and to God. That is no small thing.

#### Consider these facts:

We have not worshipped at full capacity since the middle of Lent, but we have never once cancelled a week of worship. We moved online and later modified worship to be safe (as best we knew how). A small team has burned and delivered DVD's of worship to households that can't access worship online. Some of us even invited new people to come and see what God was doing and promising in online worship. With any luck, our new bell choir director will make his worship debut soon. This is only possible because of the support and participation of this congregation and the flexibility and creativity of our music staff and worship committee. (Do you remember some of those Lenten faith stories? If you can't please go back and watch one or two on Youtube.)

We have continued to feed and house our neighbors, despite a massive recession hitting our paychecks and portfolios. We have paid rent and utilities for dozens of neighbors who found themselves without income or with dramatically reduced income due to the shutdown and its aftermath. We have fed our neighborhood and kept our eyes on the needs of our neighbors with most need by keeping all of our pre-pandemic commitments to partner ministries like Place of Hope. That is only possible because this congregation has continued to give, some households in dramatic and sacrificial ways, despite or even because of the recession.

We are launching a 3-pronged faith formation approach (online, hybrid, and in -person all at one time!) so that no matter what happens with the virus, children, youth, and adults at Atonement will continue to learn the story of the God who loves and saves us. That is only possible because our core of faithful leaders is just that - faithful - and because we have been blessed to welcome new people into our faith formation teams.

We could go on, but there is only so much space in the newsletter and we need to ask you for a few things:

- 1) Please join us for worship, and join us in leading worship. We aren't worshipping the way we all want, but we are in it together and we have Christ with us always. Your pastors, our staff musicians, and or worship team can help you figure out how to read a lesson or prayers, share a gift of music, or produce the worship video. You can do any of these things in person or online, depending on what feels safe to you.
- 2) Please continue to support our mission and ministry with your time, talents, and treasure. Your church council has carefully managed our finances so that we are in a strong financial position heading into the end of the calendar year. Your financial support makes it possible for us to keep our missions commitments, pay our staff and keep the lights on for the community groups that continue to use our space in pandemic-safe ways.
- 3) Please consider joining in faith formation as a learner and a leader. Our adult ed series will start soon and Sunday school and Confirmation will have already started by the time you receive this newsletter. We need pen pals for every child (Homebound folks, we're looking at you! Learning about your lives and faith has blessed us, and we think your faith could be a blessing to child and that child a blessing to you!) We would also like to start the background checking process for confirmation guides and Sunday school teachers ASAP so that we can ramp up in-person learning and fellowship when it is safe to do so.
