Sunday, March 29, Palm Sunday Worship (approximately 4-5 hours)

Monday, March 30, Work on Projects

Tuesday, March 31, Work on Projects

Wednesday, April 1 travel to Montego Bay by bus and fly to Minneapolis

A day at the beach will be substituted for one of the work days.

Cost: \$500 for Bus travel on Jamaica and lodging at the housekeeping area in Spring Village.

IT TAKES FAITH TO PLANT SEEDS FOR A HARVEST IN 2026

Only people who have been to Sunbeam truly understand the ministry of Sunbeam Children's Home. Atonement sent their first short term mission team in 1992. Since that time, many people have had life-changing experiences at Sunbeam as they have been immersed in the life of the boys of Sunbeam. They have lived with the boys, prayed, sung, worked with the boys as they played games, gave hugs, fed the boys and shared their faith with the boys.

Each short-term missionary had a unique experience. Their hearts were touched by different conversations with the boys, the staff of Sunbeam, and the Jamaicans they encountered on their travels. Many missionaries shared their experience with their sons and daughters as they wanted to model the importance of service to others.

Sunbeam is in a state of transition. In March 2024, the government funding for Sunbeam ended and the 45 boys were placed in government run children's homes. Since that time Sunbeam has been rebuilding a program for 5 boys in residence and 15-20 boys in weekend soccer programs.

Switching to funding from the parental support and farm produce takes time. Creating a reliable source of income from farm produce has had setbacks because of excessive heat during the summer of 2025 and the flooding and wind damage caused by Hurricane Melissa on October 28, 2025.

What is needed to supplement income from farm produce and parent contributions?

Funding is needed to feed the boys, provide for their education and to pay care staff and agricultural workers.
