WHO?

If you profess faith in Christ, have completed at least two years of college, and possess an unquenchable curiosity and a passion for journalism, you're eligible. You'll have a great opportunity to sharpen writing skills and see if you have the IQ and DQ (determination quotient) to develop a successful career in journalism.

WHERE?

WJI students for the past three years have given high ratings to the facilities, food, and friendliness at Dordt University in Sioux Center, Iowa. For four years in a row, the *Wall Street Journal* has ranked it the number one university in the nation for student engagement.

WHY?

Journalism desperately needs Christians with intellect, wisdom, fortitude, and ability. WJI intends to train those willing to wrestle with what it means to practice biblical objectivity as a dutiful, skillful reporter.

WHAT?

You'll focus on news/feature writing and reporting for magazine, website, and radio—all part of a comprehensive education that meets the demands of the industry. You'll draft print stories, record radio spots, and film video reports with close guidance from experts in the field.

WHEN?

This year's course begins May 15 and runs through May 30, 2020. Accepted students will receive a scholarship covering the cost of tuition, housing, and all lunches and dinners.

WORLD Journalism Institute's mission is to recruit, equip, place, and encourage journalists who are Christians. Class size remains small so every student receives individual attention. We treat story subjects as people created in God's image and not mere assignment topics. We explore the relationship of faith and artful truth-telling so course graduates can report the news while remaining committed to the inerrant Word of God.
