Thank You, Stephen Ministers!

As we enter Thanksgiving week, I am incredibly grateful to the special men and women who offer care to those who are hurting. Our Stephen Ministers personify St. Paul's directive to **"Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ"** (Galatians 6:2).

Stephen Ministry is an interdenominational, international program that trains lay people in distinctively Christian care. Stephen Ministers are simply Christians with a heart of care. The basic philosophy of the ministry, which is named for St. Stephen, one of the first Christian deacons and martyrs, is that **someone who is walking a difficult path should not have to do it alone**; that having a companion on the way, someone outside of the family dynamics, can make the journey more bearable.

Those we commission this morning have received more than **50 hours of training** in active listening, focusing on process rather than goals, keeping confidentiality, and tapping into Christian resources. The training has been led by our Stephen Leader, **Hank Dobbins**.

From this point forward, these and our other Stephen Ministers are available to be matched with someone in need of additional support. The relationship is **confidential** and individual. The Stephen Minister meets with the care receiver, usually for about an hour once a week, in person or virtually, for as long as needed. The Stephen Minister listens, reflects back what they are hearing, does not try to fix or solve, prays with and for the care receiver, and provides a reliable presence, representing Jesus for that person.

I hope you are prayerfully considering how you can make a commitment of your time, talent, and financial resources in the upcoming year and say, **"Yes, we are the church together!"**


Are You Feeling Weak, Downcast, or Sad? Start Giving Thanks!
