I don't know whether to celebrate (and maybe boast) about the summer months here at the church or say how excited I am looking forward to the coming days of autumn! So, let me do a bit of both.

If you're 70 1/2 or older, consider making the donation from your IRA. You can transfer up to \$100,000 annually from a traditional IRA directly to charity or nonprofit. The charitable transfers count as all or part of your required minimum distribution, but unlike other IRA payouts, these direct gifts are not added to your taxable income. It can be a great way to get a tax benefit from a charitable gift even if you don't itemize.



A Moment in Elm Park History BY ED E ROGERS

When the Scranton Board of Trade observed its 50th anniversary in 1917, it published a special edition of its Journal to celebrate the occasion.

A perusal of its pages shows how important Elm Park members were to the commercial and business life of the city that had been incorporated just a few months earlier.

The Board, which became the Chamber of Commerce in 1923, had as its sole purpose “helping Scranton grow.”

The first president after the organization received its charter was an Elm Park member, Lewis Pughe, a former state representative who was a partner in the Moines & Pughe bakery at Lackawanna and North Washington Avenues.

He was an active member of what was then the First Methodist Episcopal Church of Scranton and for many years was a member of its official board.

The list of those who followed Mr. Pughe in the Board’s chairmanship is laced with members of the church. Among them were:

Congressmen William Connell and Thomas Dale, Capt. William A. May, John T. Porter, James G. Shepherd and Ralph E. Weeks.

The Journal cited William Connell’s son Charles as one of the city’s “builders.” He succeeded his father, who died in 1909, as president of the Scranton Button Co. and Lackawanna Mills, two of the largest manufacturing plants of their kind in the world,

The two plants employed more than 2,000. The button company was pressing more than 3 million buttons a day as well as parts for telephones, electrical insulators and, the Journal reported, “A tremendous order for phonograph records.” Lackawanna Mills was one of the largest underwear manufacturers in the country and worked around the clock making “long-Johns” for American troops fighting in World War I.

Charles Connell dabbled in politics, too. He was elected to the Sixty-seventh Congress from the 10th District of Pennsylvania and served from March 4, 1921, until his death in Scranton on Sept. 26, 1922.

His name is one of the Connell children molded into the bells hanging in the Elm Park tower but he may not have been a member of the church.

A search of the record book for 1905 to 1914 by Carole Anderson found a whole page of Connells. Charles’ name was included but the remarks section contains a note “never joined he says.”

Elm Park members who were active in the Board of Trade at the time of the anniversary included Cyrus D. Jones, Charles Schlager, G. Frank Reynolds, James Connell and C.S. Woolworth.

The Journal is full of notes on how members of this church played important roles in development of this region’s commercial and industrial areas.

Congressman William Connell was in the chair when the Scranton Button Works and Lackawanna Mills were established. Captain May’s term saw the Scranton Lace Co. and Eureka Printing Co. begin operations. Ralph E. Weeks was credited with “working wonders” to save International Correspondence Schools when it came upon hard times during World War I.

Cyrus Jones was vice president of the Grand Union Tea Co., one of the nation’s largest grocery store chains; Charles Schlager was a coal company owner and banker; G. Frank Reynolds was in the real estate and banking business; James Connell, a brother of William, was a vice president of the Clark & Snover tobacco company, and C.S. Woolworth an official of the five and dime store chain that bore his family name.



All women and friends of Elm Park United Methodist Church are invited to join us to learn what we are all about.


Miracles happen!


