CROSS CRAFT

Make this special cross as a reminder of Jesus' death and resurrection.



What you need:

- Adult help
- Piece of wood
- 5 nails
- Hammer
- 2 balls of yarn (blue and yellow)

What you do:

1. Hammer the nails into the wood to form a cross shape (see example).
2. Tie the blue yarn to the bottom nail. Wrap it up and around the top nail and back down to the bottom nail. Then wrap it around the middle nail and around the side nails. Repeat until the yarn is wrapped about halfway up the exposed nails.
3. Repeat step two with the yellow yarn. Wrap it around the nails until only the heads are visible.

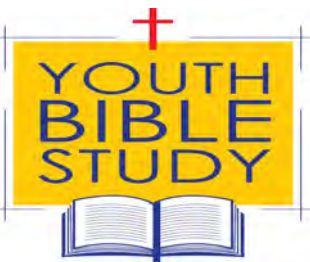

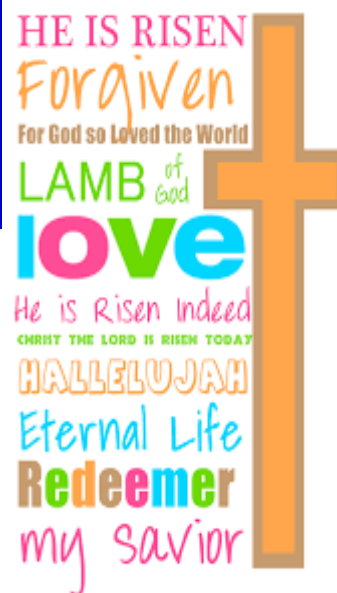

Another reports its Wesley Praise Dance Ministry's mission is to minister to the body of Christ the heart of God, through movement and creative expressions of praise, worship and prayer.

Pastor Mike recalls that in the late 50's and early 60's when he was a young person in the Methodist church dancing had become permissible in many of our churches.

Square dancing was common in rural areas and provided much fellowship in the life of the community and the church. He also remembers Saturday night dances in some of the larger churches with music provided by live rock bands.

"However," our pastor adds, "I don't think dancing on Sunday was at all common, even to today," primarily "because Sunday was seen as a day to worship and to keep sacred."

There are exceptions, he pointed out. Liturgical dance is a part of Sunday morning worship in some churches that use dancers to convey visual expressions in response to God. These can include, praise, pray, sorrow, joy, etc. and can add much visual power to the worship experience."

Even though Methodists once frowned on dancing, it is a big part of the Bible, especially in the Old Testament. King David, Moses and Sister Mariam were among those who danced to praise God; Mariam danced with the Hebrews as they made it through the Red Sea back to dry land.

Many years ago, Avery and Marsh, a pastor and musician from Port Jervis, led a training session on worship at Elm Park. One of the songs they featured was "David Danced."

The stanza Pastor Mike remembers most was:

"David danced before the Lord, Danced in his Ephod

In his Holy linen (underwear), danced his thanks to God!"

*dancing
for Him*

If the newspaper correction of February 1942 was any indication, at Elm Park David would have had to do his dancing on some day other than the Sabbath.

DANCING

Seventy-five years ago dancing, especially in the church, was a touchy subject for some Methodists.

This became perfectly clear in February 1942 when the local Sunday newspaper published photos of “Sunday evening church goers” folk dancing at Elm Park in its popular rotogravure section.

Apparently The Scrantonian editors and the Elm Park office were flooded with complaints. Two days later, in an effort to appease the unhappy Methodists, the paper said it was all a mistake.

The following appeared in the newspaper’s affiliated daily, The Tribune, under a headline that proclaimed “No Dances Sundays at Elm Park Church”:

“Through an error it was stated in the caption accompanying two pictures in the rotogravure section of The Scrantonian Sunday that folk dancing had been held on Sunday nights at Elm Park Methodist Church. This is untrue. The two pictures showing the dancing were taken on a Thursday night at the close of the 13th annual Mid-Winter Institute at the church, the Rev. Charles W. Phillips, associate pastor, said last night.”

Presumably that quelled the uproar and Elm Parkers got back to the other news of the day such as the Japanese continuing to capture island after island in the Pacific while American troops fought to maintain a foothold on Corregidor in the Philippines, the first U.S. troops landing in Britain and similar events of World War 2.

Dancing and some other forms of entertainment have evoked much debate in Methodist circles for years.

The 1892 Book of Discipline says the General Conference had adopted a resolution declaring “dancing, theater going, card playing, and like worldly indulgences to be contrary to the spirit of Christianity.” It went on to instruct the pastors on how we are to discipline sinners who indulge in worldly pleasures.

That thinking remained until May of 1924 when, at a meeting in Maryland, the General Conference repealed it saying Methodism should be a religion that “appeals to the conscience of a man and keeps him away from these things.”

“We will change the minister standing in the pulpit with a police club in his hand to a minister standing there with a shepherd’s crook,” declared the chairman of the Committee on the State of the Church.

In the years since then things – on the civil as well as the religious fronts – have continued to change.


In Pennsylvania, the Blue Laws that were intended to preserve the sanctity of the Christian Sabbath, gradually were repealed or were just plain ignored.

And dancing began to find its way into many churches. Pastor Mike Bealla says the current United Methodist discipline doesn’t mention it.



A search of the Internet for “Methodists and dancing” results in scores of “hits.”

United Methodist churches across the country are sponsoring dance instructions and dance sessions featuring everything from old fashion folk dances to the ballroom style.

One says its line dancing group provides an opportunity for physical as well as spiritual wholeness.

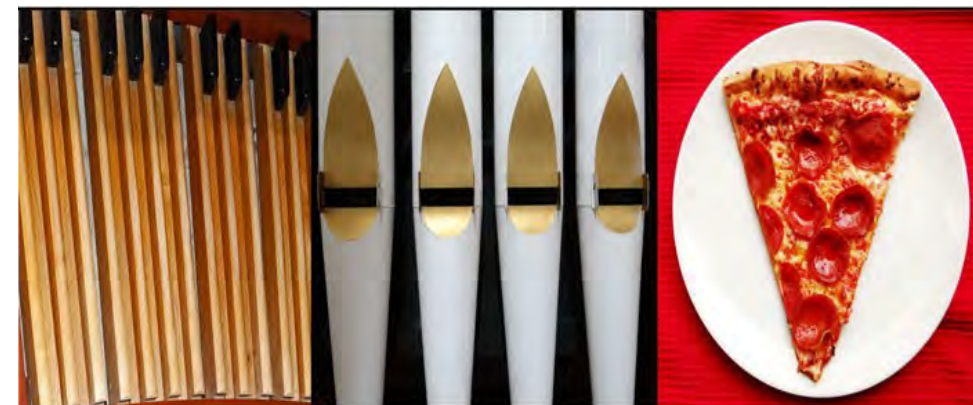
