APRIL – MAY

Birder's Paradise

You'll experience moderate temperatures at this time of year and the bush is abound with greenery and new life as the rainy season comes to an end. The lush atmosphere at this time of year makes for colorful landscapes and excellent birding.

JUNE – AUGUST

Perfect for Everyone

As Zambia heads into its cool, dry season, this time of year provides excellent game viewing with warm days and cool nights. The grasses begin to dry up and the Winterthorn Trees begin to change color and drop more pods, attracting elephants and the many other creatures that snack on them.

SEPTEMBER

Sunshine and Sightings

Expect warm days and nights as the hot dry season begins and the forest transforms. As foliage dries up, light begins streaming through the trees creating that iconic Lower Zambezi mood with hues of yellow, orange and red.

OCTOBER

Calling All Photographers

Temperatures rise in the height of the dry season, making October a photographer's dream. Sightings are spectacular at this time of year as concentrations of wildlife congregate near the remaining water sources. Dust adds to the photographic atmosphere, creating incredible skies and dramatic landscapes.

NOVEMBER

Baby Season

The landscape in the valley commences its annual transformation once more as the rainy season begins. This time of year remains hot, ideal for cooling off in the plunge pool in the mid hours of the day. November is baby fever here, as the impala, waterbuck and kudu begin dropping their young. Seeing newborns stumble on their new wobbly legs is such a treat at this time of year.
