- UN NUEVO RENACER IS PREPARING TO TRANSITION OUT OF MOUNTVILLE COB. D.E. PETE KONTRA AND I HAVE ASSISTED PASTOR EPI COSME AND THE LEADERSHIP TEAM IN VISITING POTENTIAL SITES. A PROMISING LOCATION IN EPHRATA HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED, WITH FINAL ARRANGEMENTS EXPECTED THIS MONTH.
- OASIS DE ESPERANZA HAS SUCCESSFULLY RELOCATED FROM LEBANON COB TO A NEW DOWNTOWN LEBANON SITE ACROSS FROM CITY HALL. THE GRAND OPENING ON APRIL 13 WAS SPIRIT-FILLED AND WELL ATTENDED.
- ARBOR PARK HAS MOVED FROM ITS FORMER LOCATION DUE TO SAFETY CONCERNS. THE NEW SITE IN LANCASTER
 OFFICIALLY OPENED ON APRIL 12.

PLEASE CONTINUE TO LIFT UP OUR SPANISH-SPEAKING CONGREGATIONS AS THEY SERVE FAITHFULLY IN THEIR NEW SPACES.




Ministry Commission

THE DISTRICT MINISTRY COMMISSION ACTS IN ALL AREAS RELATED TO CALLING, CREDENTIALING, AND SUPPORTING PEOPLE IN MINISTRY IN THE ATLANTIC NORTHEAST DISTRICT. DURING THE COMMISSION'S MONTHLY MEETINGS, MEMBERS INTERVIEW CANDIDATES FOR LICENSING AND ORDINATION TO MINISTRY AND REVIEW THEIR WRITTEN STATEMENTS, PLAN EDUCATIONAL EVENTS, RECEIVE UPDATES ON PASTORAL PLACEMENTS,

PRAY IN SUPPORT OF MINISTERS IN THE DISTRICT AND THEIR NEEDS, AND CONSIDER AND STREAMLINE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES. THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, THE COMMISSION RECOMMENDS TO THE DISTRICT BOARD ORDINATION OF INDIVIDUALS, ORDINATION RENEWAL, OR OTHER APPROPRIATE ACTIONS.

SERVING ON THE COMMISSION THIS PAST YEAR HAVE BEEN RAY DOTTER (CHAIR), ENTEN ELLER, NANCY HESS, BOB KETTERING, ARLYN MORALES (THROUGH 2/2025), AND DANA STATLER (3/2025-PRESENT). WE MEET MONTHLY WITH DISTRICT EXECUTIVE PETE KONTRA AND OFFICE ADMINISTRATOR KRISTA DICKSON.

THE MINISTRY COMMISSION COLLABORATES WITH CONGREGATIONS AND THEIR MEMBERS WHO ARE EXPLORING A CALL TO MINISTRY. WE PROVIDE RESOURCES GUIDING A TIME OF DISCERNMENT AND GUIDANCE AND SUPPORT FOR TRAINING. AN ANNUAL LICENSED MINISTER REVIEW AND RENEWAL PROCESS ALLOWS LICENSED MINISTERS TO REPORT ON THEIR EDUCATIONAL AND MINISTRY JOURNEYS AND RECEIVE AFFIRMATION FOR THEIR CONTINUED CALL TO MINISTRY.





Jim Bridgeman was ordained at Lancaster COB in December 2024. At 93 years of age, he is the oldest person in the history of the COB to be newly ordained.

This year our activities include ordination review for the denomination's five-year renewal of ordination credentials, ethics training exemptions, and approval of continuing education units (CEU) for training that helps ministers meet their education requirements to continue ordination.

DURING THE PAST YEAR (AS OF JUNE 10, 2025), WE HAD REVIEWED ORDINATION RENEWALS AND RECOMMENDED OR APPROVED THE FOLLOWING:

- •RENEWAL OF ORDINATION OF 71 MINISTERS WHO HAVE MET ALL REQUIREMENTS
- **•**ORDINATION OF SIX MINISTERS
- •TERMINATION OF ORDINATION OF 13 MINISTERS ALL AT THEIR OWN REQUEST
- **•LICENSING OF TWO MINISTERS**
- •TERMINATION OF THE LICENSING OF TWO MINISTERS AGAIN AT THEIR OWN REQUEST.

The commission supports our ministers with prayer each month. We receive prayer requests and pray for a group of ministers, recognizing individual concerns and joys, then send a card to each minister for whom we prayed. In addition, the commission hosted a ministers' appreciation event for all ministers and their families June 13 at the Ephrata Church of the Brethren. 60 people registered.

DURING THE WEEK OF JULY BRETHREN 25, 2022, A SINGLE STORM SYSTEM MOVED Disaster Ministries ACROSS MULTIPLE STATES CAUSING FLASH FLOODING FROM MISSOURI TO PARTS OF VIRGINIA

AND WEST VIRGINA. THE FLOODING RESULTED IN DAMAGED HOMES AND BUILD-INGS, LOSS OF LIFE AND SHOLE TOWNS LEFT UNDERWATER, ESPECIALLY IN THE

• GREATER ST. LOUIS, MO AREA AND A LARGE AREA OF

SOUTHEASTERN KY.

WE ARE ABLE TO OFFER FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO OUR ANE DISTRICT CHURCHES THROUGH OUR FUNDS. THE ANE DISTRICT BARNABAS FUND HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED TO SHARE THE BLESSING OF FINANCIAL RESOURCES WITH THOSE WHO EXPRESS A MINISTRY-DRIVEN NEED. THE FUND SEEKS TO ENCOURAGE THE MINISTRY OF CONGREGATIONS THROUGH A GRANT-BASED MINISTRY INVESTMENT STRATEGY THAT SEEKS KINGDOM-BASED MINISTRY RESULTS THROUGH SHARED RESOURCES, FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY, MINISTRY PLANNING, AND ECONOMIC PARTNERING.

ON MAY 12 THE COMMITTEE MET TO REVIEW THE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AND APPROVED A TO-TAL OF \$102.400 FOR ANNUAL FUNDING IN 2026. THE CHURCHES WHO WILL RECEIVE THIS ANNUAL FUNDING ARE ALPHA AND OMEGA, BROOKLYN FIRST, GERMANTOWN, AND HARRISBURG FIRST.

THE BALANCE IN THE BARNABAS FUND IS VERY LOW. WE ENCOURAGE ANE DISTRICT CHURCHES, SMALL GROUPS AND INDI-VIDUALS TO GENEROUSLY SUPPORT THIS FUND THAT PROVIDES SUPPORT TO THE MINISTRY OF THESE ANE DISTRICT URBAN CHURCHES. A SEPARATE UP TO DATE FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THIS FUND WILL BE AVAILABLE AT DISTRICT CONFERENCE.

STEWARDSHIP WAY FORWARD COMMITMENT:

THE STEWARDSHIP COMISSION IS COMMITTED TO PROVIDING IMPORTANT ONGOING FINANCIAL SUPPORT/FUNDING TO ALL THE ANE COMMISSIONS AS THEY WORK WITHIN THE COVENANT AND STRENGTHEN IT BY THEIR ACTIONS AND DECISIONS HOLDING US ALL ACCOUNTABLE FOR HOLISTIC STEWARDSHIP PRACTICES.

THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF STEWARDSHIP COMMISSION — TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FINANCIAL ASSETS AND AFFAIRS OF THE ANE DISTRICT. WE RECEIVE, INVEST, PROTECT AND MAINTAIN THE ASSETS ENTRUSTED TO THE DISTRICT. THIS INCLUDES DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS AS WELL AS MONITORING AND GROWING FINANCIAL HOLDINGS IN SUPPORT OF THE MINISTRIES TO THE CONGREGATIONS, FELLOWSHIPS AND PROJECTS WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE ANE DISTRICT.

THE COMMISSION IS COMPRISED OF A TEAM OF FIVE VOTING MEMBERS, AS WELL AS THREE NON-VOTING MEMBERS, CONSISTING OF THE ANE TREASURER, ANE ASSISTANT TREASURER, AND THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE.

THANKS TO THE JOHN AND JEAN STONER ESTATE, THE COMMISSION ESTABLISHED THE FACILITIES ASSISTANCE FUND IN 2020 TO SUPPORT ANE CONGREGATIONS IN IMPROVING OR EXPANDING FACILITIES THAT ALIGN WITH THEIR MINISTRY-DRIVEN VISION. THIS FUND ALLOWS US TO GIVE BACK FINANCIALLY AND FNCOURAGE GROWTH ACROSS THE DISTRICT. ALL CONGREGATIONS ARE INVITED. TO APPLY FOR SMALL GRANTS.

The Bucher Meetinghouse

SINCE THE CONGREGATION PREVIOUSLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF

THE BUCHER MEETING HOUSE AND CEMETERY HAS WITHDRAWN FROM THE CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN, RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE PROPERTY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH

THE DEED, NOW FALLS TO THE ATLANTIC NORTHEAST DISTRICT (ANE). ANE HAS ALSO RECEIVED FUNDS DESIGNATED FOR THE UPKEEP OF THIS HISTORIC SITE. ON JUNE 1, 2025, BOB KETTERING AND CAROLYN FITZKEE LED A HYMN SING IN THE MEETING HOUSE, WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY 64 PEOPLE. AN OFFERING OF \$900 WAS COLLECTED TO SUPPORT ONGOING PROPERTY MAINTENANCE. THE ANE STEWARDSHIP COMMISSION HAS APPOINTED A COMMITTEE TO OVERSEE THE CARE OF THE PROPERTY. THE BARNABAS FUND, FORMERLY THE MISSION CHURCH SUPPORT FUND, IS THE ATLANTIC NORTH-EAST DISTRICT'S MOST ACTIVE FINANCIAL SUPPORT PROGRAM. EACH MAY, AS THE NEXT YEAR'S MINISTRY INVESTMENT PLAN (MIP) IS DEVELOPED, THE BARNABAS FUND TEAM PLEDGES OVER \$100,000 IN MONTHLY SUPPORT TO FOUR URBAN CONGREGATIONS: ALPHA & OMEGA, BROOKLYN FIRST, GERMANTOWN, AND HARRISBURG FIRST. SUPPORT IS ALSO AVAILABLE TO OTHER CONGREGATIONS SERVING COMMUNITIES WITH SIGNIFICANT ECONOMIC CHALLENGES. TO QUALIFY, THESE CHURCHES MUST HAVE AN ACTIVE OUTREACH MINISTRY, LIMITED RESOURCES DUE TO CIRCUMSTANCES

BEYOND THEIR CONTROL, AND COMMUNITY NEEDS EXCEEDING THEIR CAPACITY. BECAUSE THE FUND'S BALANCE NEARLY DIMINISHES WITH EACH ANNUAL COMMITMENT, CONGREGATIONS ARE ENCOURAGED TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE BARNABAS FUND—ABOVE AND BEYOND THEIR MIP GIVING—IF THEY ARE ABLE. A SPECIAL THANKS TO ALL INDIVIDUALS AND CONGREGATIONS WHO FAITHFULLY GIVE TO THIS FUND. SEE WITNESS & OUTREACH REPORT FOR MORE INFORMATION.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR THE COMMISSION

- APPROVED 2026 MIP of \$499,535 FOR EXECUTIVE TEAM CONSIDERATION.
 - * This represents an \$20,732 (4%) decrease from the 2025 MIP, largely due to removing Barnabas Funding from the MIP. (Barnabas grants will be funded through other District funds). Executive Committee then approved a \$53,346 addition to the MIP for a new Director of Discipleship Ministries staff position.
- THE STEWARDSHIP COMMISSION CONTRACTED WITH TROUT CPA TO COMPLETE A COMPILATION OF OUR 2024 FINANCES. THIS AS BEEN COMPLETED AND REVIEWED BY THE COMMISSION, ANE

- TREASURER AND ASSISTANT TREASURER, AND INTERIM DIRECTOR OF FINANCE. A COPY IS FILED IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE.
- WE DEVELOPED AND APPROVED A POLICY DOCUMENT FOR THE WITH-DRAWING CHURCHES FUND.
- AT THE REQUEST OF THE COB GLOBAL MINISTRY DIRECTOR, WE APPROVED A GRANT OF \$5000 TO HELP PURCHASE A VEHICLE FOR A PASTOR IN BURUNDI.
- IN MARCH, WE CLOSED ON THE SALE OF THE LONG RUN CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN
- SO FAR IN 2025, WE REVIEWED, APPROVED AND FUNDED THREE REQUESTS FROM THE FACILITIES ASSISTANCE FUND, FOR A TOTAL OF \$22,500.
