



As an educator, you can support democracy by encouraging students to register to vote. Will you help?

Dear Educator,

I'm part of a non-partisan, nationwide effort to encourage our students to vote. As you know, [millions of college students are not even registered](#). We educators are in a unique position to help change that. I'm hoping you'll join me in taking three simple actions:

1. When fall classes begin, take a few minutes in or adjacent to class time to discuss voting and encourage students to register to vote. Direct students to [vote.org](#) to **register**, or to **re-register** if their address has changed, and to sign up for voting by mail. Of course, you'll want to keep this completely non-partisan, both for your protection and to maintain the project's integrity.
2. Go to [abcVOTE](#) to download your own copy of this email. Send or forward this email to at least three colleagues urging them to participate.
3. Post this information to your formal and informal professional networks.
