Using too much road salt in winter has a downside.



Excess salt on your driveway or sidewalk runs off into
streams and rivers — making our freshwater salty.



When our waterways become salty, it harms
wildlife like trout, salamanders, and ducks. At
home, road salt can hurt your plants and pets.



1. Use less salt on your driveway and sidewalks.

(experts recommend 1 handful per square yard)



2. Sweep up excess salt after a storm and use it again.

(leftover salt means you can use less next time)



3. Tell your friends and neighbors how to be #WinterSaltSmart, too!
