Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As I write this letter, Hurricane Dorian remains almost halted over Grand Bahama wreaking catastrophic damage. The pictures that are coming out of the Abacoos, which were laid waste on Saturday and Sunday, are incomprehensible in the destruction that they show. We wait for clearer news from Grand Bahama.

Our diocese always responds so generously to the needs of our neighbours and I remember with such gratitude your response during other times like these. Three years ago we raised more money for hurricane relief than we had ever raised before, and our gifts made a significant difference for those in need.

Today we must respond once again. We hope to raise \$50,000 by the beginning of next week to send to the Bishop of the Bahamas. Our immediate action will allow him direct critical help to individuals and families in the Abacos and Grand Bahama. The Bishop and his colleagues can reach people at this point in ways that no one or no other agency can, and our response will enable him to reach out with practical and life-saving help.

I am asking each congregation to take part in this appeal, so the Bishop and his clergy and people will know that every community in the Diocese of Southeast Florida responded to help our sisters and

brothers in our companion Diocese of the Bahamas. It does not matter what you give; but it matters hugely that we each do what we are able.

I am grateful to Rhonda Clinton, the Executive Director of Episcopal Charities, who will be working with me to co-ordinate our diocesan-wide response. I am also grateful to the Deans for their leadership of our response. They will be reaching out to the clergy and wardens in the deaneries.

You are welcome to give as is best for you, but I encourage everyone to give through your congregations. This is much the strongest witness, when we act together.
