As we begin a new year and a new decade this is a wonderful time to look towards the future. Where might God be leading Immanuel? How will our ministry make a difference to transform the lives of those in our congregation, our community, and our world by the good news of Jesus Christ? I don't have 2020 vision, but I do envision some areas on which we might focus in 2020.

First, I anticipate the leaders of our congregation will work together in the new year to set forth priorities and goals. At our annual meeting in January 2018, the congregation approved a purpose statement and guiding principles to guide our ministry. For the past two years these statements have given clarity in our decision making, while inspiring us to live more fully into our identity and mission. In 2020 I look forward to engaging in more concrete strategic planning for the next 1-5 years based upon our purpose and guiding principles.

I also envision our congregation will make a decision about our Linden House property in the coming year. The future of this building has been discussed since 2017 at Council meetings and at Linden House Advisory Team meetings. The latter group has now brought before the Council a recommendation upon which the Council will act. From there any final decisions about the future of Linden House will come before the congregation, first within informal educational settings, and then at a special congregational meeting.

Outreach will continue to be an important focus for Immanuel in 2020. This means we will continue our already established ministries: weekly Food Fellowship meals, monthly Acoustic Alchemy Studio music concerts, and ongoing accompaniment to our New American family, the Betoubams. While we want to build upon the strengths of these programs, I hope we also remain open to where the Spirit may be leading us in new areas of outreach.


We have been blessed by the presence and gifts of Mary Riedl this past year as our Children and Youth Leader. With the proposal to increase her hours in 2020, I look forward to increased participation by the congregation in supporting Mary's leadership to strengthen our ministry with youth and families.

Worship is at the heart of our life together as a church. Yet we know that in general, attendance in mainline churches is not growing. How can we become a more invitational church so that others might want to gather with us on Sunday mornings? The Council will be reading the book, *The Invitational Christian* at its monthly meetings this year. Extra copies are available if you would like to read along with us.

These are just a few of my thoughts on where God may be leading Immanuel in the coming year. How about you? What do you envision? How will you participate in making your vision a reality?

During this time of Epiphany, a season of light, may we be led by the light of Christ in the new year!



Coffee Hour Hosts Needed

As we approach the new year at Immanuel Lutheran Church, we are creating a coffee hour schedule for the first quarter of 2020. If you can help, please let Parish Administrator Carolyn Korn (parishadmin@ilcboise.org) know.

One person is needed for each service (early and late) on Sunday.

For the **early** person, the responsibilities are:

- Plug in the coffee pots before service
- Set out coffee creamer and juice
- Set out pastries - 6 dozen per service - (either from the freezer or those that you have brought).

For the **late** person, the duties are:

- Refresh coffee condiments tray, paper goods, cold drinks (if needed)
- Set out pastries -6 dozen per service- (either from the freezer or those that you have brought).
- Unplug the coffee pots
- Put the coffee creamer and juice in the refrigerator
- Cover any food left over (staff will put it away on Monday)

Notice that washing dishes and coffee pot cleaning are not part of the duties.

AN UPDATE FROM THE NEW AMERICANS MINISTRY TEAM (NAMT)

Some recent highlights in our continuing journey with the Betoubam family (Blaise Richard, Cecile, Arnaud, Yolanda, Geraldine, Josianne, and Charlot):

- Thanks to the generosity of Stan and Carol Hoobing, this family is now the proud owners of the Hoobing van which was first donated to the church and then given to the Betoubams. The oldest son, Arnaud, is the only driver at present. He now transports the family to Sunday worship, drives himself to work, and makes sure his mother has a ride to and from her work.
- Bunk beds were donated to the family by the Global Donation Team, coordinated by Mary Lou and Brian Phillips, a big addition to their home furnishings.
- A continuing priority for the family is bringing their daughter Christelle here from Africa. It is a complicated situation in ascertaining the documents she needs to travel here. Ellen Anderson is continuing to work with the parents, International Rescue Committee, and other resources.
- Arnaud is working full time at B & D Foods. He is also attending Frank Church Evening School four nights a week, working on his high school diploma, taking an English and a History class.
- Blaise Richard and Cecile are waiting to hear from the Learning Lab about starting classes in January. In the meantime, Ellen Anderson and Jo Stensaas are tutoring them in English.
- Bob Firman and John Hermanson plan to do some tutoring with Arnaud in Math after the first of the year.
- Charlot is eager to begin piano lessons. Any recommendations on how we can help him do that?
- Margo Healy will be checking in with the family about food needs over Christmas. Jo Stensaas is checking on the possibility of getting Pastor Gretchen's sermons translated into French—with the possibility of family members reading the sermon as Pastor is preaching it.
- Margo Healy, Ellen Anderson, and Jo Stensaas continue to work with me in co-coordinating the efforts of this Ministry Team. Feel free to contact any of us if you have questions, concerns, or suggestions.

In general, our relationship with the Betoubam family seems to be going well. They continue to be deeply appreciative of the warm reception they are receiving from the congregation. They do feel loved and cared about. If you are wondering how you can be helpful, simply greet them at worship and try to carry on a basic conversation so they can practice their English. You might also consider a financial gift to assist the Team in helping support this family with special needs on their journey. Church Council Update

The Council met Monday, December 16, 2019, at 5:30pm. Below is a recap of the meeting, pending Council approval:

- Approved the Consent Agenda including Council Meeting Agenda (12/16/19), Council Meeting Minutes (11/11/19), Pastor's Monthly Report, Endowment Committee, Stewardship Committee and Young Ministry Committee.
- Discussed Church Attendance Report.
- Approved Revised October 2019 Financial Reports.
- Discussed November 2019 Financial Reports. Follow up required for approval.
- Reviewed December 16, 2019 MIF loan balance, Capital Campaign and current gap between funds given/pledged and the final project cost. As of December 16, 2019, \$21,194 additional funds required, including Interest, to pay off the loan by January 2021.
- Reviewed Nominating Committee progress on recruiting for 2020 Council Members.
- Discussed Linden House Advisory Team's Final Report and deferred review of options to early next year.
- Reviewed 2020 proposed budget. Council recognizes and appreciates all the work done in preparing the budget.
- Approved Finance Committee recommendation to allocate interest (\$1,356.88) from the General Fund Reserve to the Mission Endowment Fund to represent interest from March 2005 through September 1, 2019 on the original \$10,000 donation plus actual interest earned on Schwab account for September, October and November 2019 (\$4.00).
- Reviewed 2020 Building Lock up List and plan for 2020 Council Devotions.
- Reviewed plan for and communication of Information Sessions to be held, Sunday, January 19, 2020, to discuss the budget and any proposals and answer questions before the Annual Meeting, Sunday, January 26, 2020. Reports for the Annual Report are due January 8, 2020.
- Reviewed and provided feedback for "Disarm" poster.
- Approved Endowment Committee recommendation to appoint Amy Docktor to the Endowment Committee to serve a three-year term (2020-2022).
- Reviewed proposal to offer Community Yoga in ILC fellowship Hall and requested further research on proposal.
- Discussed Immanuel outside reader board and deferred decision to January.
- Discussed Christmas gifts for Betoubam family.
