On my commute to and from church I usually listen to our local public radio station which recently had its fall fundraising campaign. While I didn't like the interruptions to the news with appeals to give, it was interesting to listen to real people give their testimonies about why they support public radio.

It also made me think about our upcoming stewardship emphasis. Sometimes we think about stewardship as the church's fall fundraising campaign—the annual interruption of business as usual in order to plea for money to support the budget.

But stewardship is so much bigger than that.

As one person said, "it's everything I do after I say I believe."

Stewardship starts with acknowledging that God is the giver of all that we have, "ourselves, our time and our possessions" as one of our offertory prayers put it.

And in response we gratefully give of ourselves—in whatever ways we can.

It's the way our giving impacts real people that inspires me to give to the church.

- When I deliver a prayer shawl or lap robe to someone going through a rough time and I see immediately the comfort it brings;
- When a child gives me a big hug after worship and I see how church has become a loving, safe space for him;
- When volunteers show up week after week, and on holidays, to not only serve but be served by those who are now part of their community at Food Fellowship;
- When mutual love is communicated despite barriers of language, culture and nationality in our friendship with a New American family in our congregation;
- When a concert-goer is moved to tears by the power of music in our Augustana Chapel.

In these and so many other ways I see the life-giving presence of God at work in our midst making a difference in peoples' lives, and I am grateful to be part of it.

As you receive a letter of invitation to offer your support to Immanuel this month, I hope you, too, will take a minute to reflect upon how you have been impacted by our ministry. And then gratefully join your community of faith as we celebrate **Grace of Giving Sunday** on October 27!

The 60 Day Journey

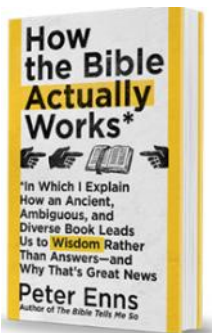

There are follow-up discussions each Sunday after both services in the library through October.

During the Adult Learning sessions at 9:45am and 12:00pm on Sunday October 20th, we will have representatives from the educational portion of the Idaho chapter of Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America. They will be offering their BeSMART presentation about responsible gun ownership. This includes teaching about the signs of suicide, ways to encourage people to lock up their guns, asking about the presence of guns in other homes people visit, and other things. Everyone is invited to attend, even if you have not been participating in the 60 Day Journey discussions.

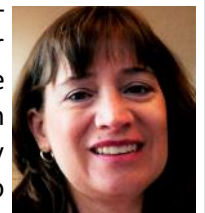

Build Us Up, Lord!

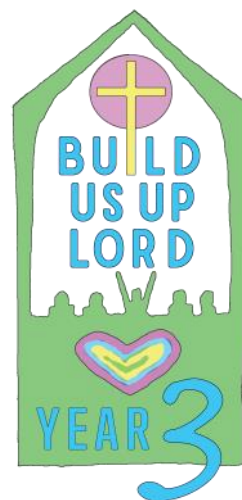
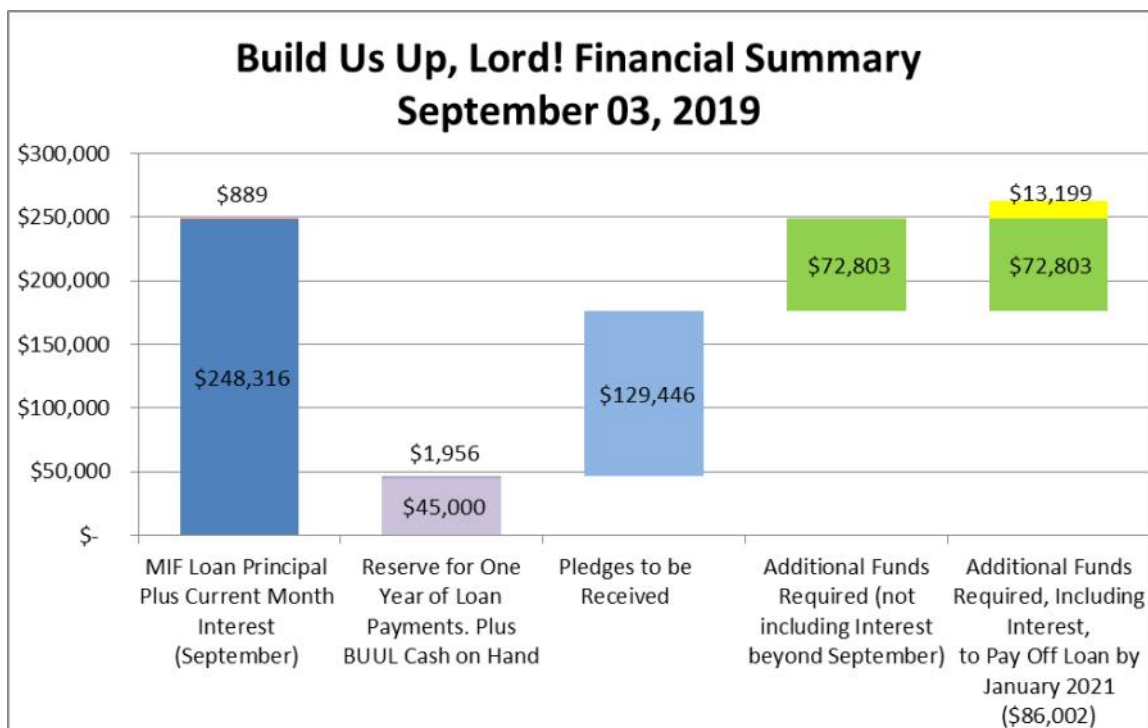
Current Financial Status - \$86,000 Needed to Pay Off Loan by January 2021!

Our current Loan Balance as of September 3, 2019 is \$248,316 plus monthly interest of \$889.

Through our **Build Us Up, Lord!** Capital Campaign we have received over \$1,151,103 through September 3. We have \$129,446 in pledges still to be received and \$1,956 BUUL Cash on Hand plus the \$45,000 reserve for one year of loan payments.

This year, we have received additional gifts of \$146,000 which, in addition to our minimum monthly loan payments, have helped to significantly reduce our loan principal. Our current gap between funds given/pledged and the final project cost is \$72,803. In other words, if all pledges were completed today, we would still need additional funds of \$72,803 to pay off the loan.

Last year, we extended our capital campaign to a fourth year (December 2020). To be mortgage free by January 2021, we need to raise an additional \$86,000 to cover the current gap (\$72,803) and the additional interest (\$13,199) on the loan. With the generosity of our members and friends, we have made amazing progress in paying down our loan this year!



Growing in the Grace of Giving

With the shorter and cooler days and arrival of the fall harvest season, it seems appropriate to reflect on the abundant gifts our gracious God has bestowed on all of us. In his publication, *A Brief History of Stewardship*, Dr. William O. Avery reminds us:

- ♦ We are not masters living in a world that we own and control, but rather we are stewards of what has been entrusted to us.
- ♦ Christian stewardship is rooted in God's gift of Jesus Christ to us, and we are entrusted with sharing this gift.
- ♦ Through God's grace, we freely receive God's gifts and joyfully use them.
- ♦ Stewardship has to do with every aspect of living out personal faith, including care of creation, lifestyle, gifts, finances and callings/vocation.
- ♦ The church depends upon "the priesthood of all believers" to assume their rightful place of servant leadership, using their gifts to participate in God's work in the world today.



You will soon be receiving a letter (and pledge card) from the Stewardship Committee containing this and other information about the Stewardship campaign for 2020. Using our Purpose Statement and Guiding Principles as a foundation, we will focus on stewardship during the month of October. Our campaign theme for 2020 is ***Growing in the Grace of Giving*** and will conclude with ***Grace of Giving*** Sunday (which is also Reformation Sunday) on October 27, 2019. We will collect the pledge cards during the 8:30 and 10:45am worship services, followed by our Oktoberfest celebration.

We invite you to set aside some quiet time to prayerfully consider how you can contribute to the ongoing ministries of Immanuel Lutheran Church for 2020. After completing your pledge card, please bring it with you to church on Sunday, October 27 when we will joyfully bring them forward during the offering. Feel free to mail or bring your pledge card to the church office if you're unable to join us that Sunday. Church Council Update

The Council met Monday, September 9, 2019 at 5:30pm. Below is a recap of the meeting, subject to Council approval:

- Approved the Consent Agenda including Council Meeting Agenda (9/9/19), Council Meeting Minutes (8/12/19), Pastor's Monthly Report, Linden House Advisory Team, Stewardship, Youth and Church Attendance Report.
- Reviewed and approved the Pastoral Review Committee Summary Report to Council and requested the development of a timeline for goal setting and future Pastoral reviews.
- Reviewed the history of the Mission Endowment Committee (MEC) and each section of the proposed Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) Policy and Procedures Manual. The Manual was created to address changes and best practices that have evolved since the MEF was created in 2000 and to establish formal operating procedures. Council approved the Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) Transition Action Plan, The Mission Endowment Committee (MEC) Annual Schedule and the MEF Policies and Procedures Manual.
- Discussed and approved July and August 2019 Financial Reports.
- Reviewed graphs of the September 3, 2019 and July 22, 2019 MIF loan balance, Capital Campaign and current gap between funds given/pledged yet to be received and the final project cost.
- Discussed and approved the Immanuel Lower Level Facility Use Task Force Proposal to purchase window coverings and wall art for the Fellowship Hall (up to \$850), with funding from Memorial Funds.
- Reviewed and approved revised Acoustic Alchemy Studio Ministry Policy.
- Barb Schmidt reported additional adjustments have been made and the elevator has been working successfully. Agreed to request additional elevator Key FOB, develop operating procedures and determine if excess funds are available to purchase an AED for Immanuel.
- Reviewed and approved revised Covenant of Conduct, a recommended best practice developed as a result of the Healthy Congregations Workshop. Council to prepare newsletter article on the Covenant of Conduct.
- Reviewed research completed and approved the proposal to accept a donated vehicle for potential use by the New American's Ministry.
- Next Council meeting is October 14, 2019, 5:30pm, Immanuel Library.
