From the Pastor *By Pastor Gretchen J. Bingea*



I am a person who likes structure in my life. Each day begins with a familiar rhythm of prayer and devotions with a cup of coffee, followed by watching the news while eating breakfast. Every week there is also a familiar rhythm of certain work to be accomplished on certain days, followed by a time of rest on Friday which is my sabbath. Therefore, it's not surprising that I also like the familiar rhythm of the church year, each season guiding my spiritual life in its own unique way.

As of Ash Wednesday, which falls on February 26th this year, we enter the season of Lent. This was a time in the early church for those preparing to be baptized at the Easter vigil. It continues to be a time for all the faithful to renew their baptismal calling to live as God's people in preparation for Easter.

During the 40 days of Lent, recalling the 40 days that Jesus was tested in the wilderness, we too enter into a time of facing whatever tests our faith, so that we might return to God, who is "slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love."

Traditionally there are certain practices or disciplines that Christians have used to guide their lives during Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving, and works of love—all strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament in worship.

There are many avenues to help you enter into the rhythm of this season of the church year. Worship on Sunday mornings and on Wednesday evenings accompanied by times of community fellowship either before or after the services. Devotionals like *Christ in our Home* and *Wondrous Love* available for your prayer time at home. Adult studies with others to stimulate and challenge your mind. Opportunities for works of love such as volunteering at our Tuesday night Food Fellowship meal. As you read through the pages of this newsletter, how might you use this season to guide you in your faith?

Whatever Lenten disciplines you choose, may they help you grow deeper in your relationship to God and others in preparation for the joy of Easter.

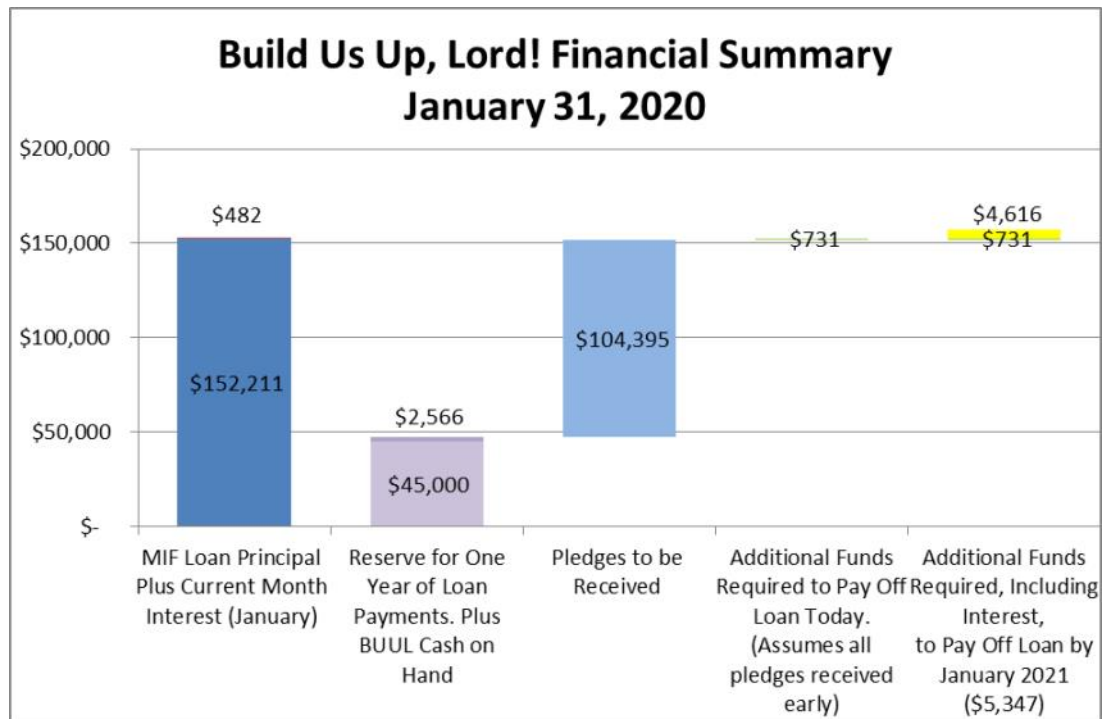
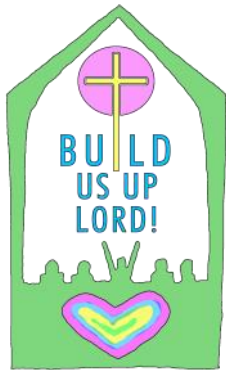

Build Us Up, Lord!

Our Goal to Pay off our Loan Early is within our Reach!

As we enter our fourth year of **Build Us Up, Lord!**, our goal to pay off the remaining loan by January 2021 is within our reach. As of January 31, 2020, our current loan balance was **\$152,211** and we had **\$104,395** Pledges to be received in 2020. In addition, we had **\$45,000** in reserve for one year of loan payments and **\$2,566** BUUL Cash on Hand. If all pledges were fulfilled today we would need only **\$731** to fully pay off the loan and we would avoid additional interest of **\$4,616**. We are thankful for each gift which helps reduce our overall loan balance and reduces the interest that comes with extending the loan out. Each Pledge fulfilled early is a blessing to Immanuel.

New Poster Displayed In Immanuel Entrances

Last fall Immanuel participated in a “60 Day Journey toward Justice in a culture of gun violence” in adult learning sessions on Sunday mornings. From those discussions a request was made to the Congregation Council to consider and take action to create posters to be hung in our buildings. The intent was to name our property as a safe space where people may gather free of fear and violence, affirming what is stated in *A Message on Community Violence* from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America: *“The cross and resurrection have broken the cycle of violence, freeing us for God’s future and for one another. We confess how we have sinned and been sinned against through violence. Through prayer and absolution, the power of what God has promised is able to disarm our captivity to violence. Gathered around word and sacrament, we remember and celebrate this gift of peace given the world in Jesus Christ.”*

At its November 11th meeting, Council approved the following language for posters at ILC: *This church is a house of prayer for all people. We worship Jesus Christ, Son of God, Prince of Peace. You are welcome here. Please enter with heart and hand disarmed.* The posters have now been made and are displayed at the entrances to the Augustana and Immanuel sanctuaries and the Administration building in between.

Newly Reinvigorated Mission Endowment Fund Awards First Annual Grants!

To celebrate our newly reinvigorated Mission Endowment Fund and to further our mission and outreach to “Share God’s Gift of Love with All!”, we awarded three grants at our Annual Congregational Meeting on January 26, 2020.

Due to funds donated years ago the Endowment Committee was able to make the first grants this year and will continue annual grants going forward. The following 2020 grants were awarded:

- ♦ Luther Heights: to fund New Americans/Refugees Family Event. \$65
- ♦ Days for Girls Intl.: to help with menstrual hygiene kits to help girls in Kenya stay in school. \$65
- ♦ Luther Seminary: in recognition of the 50 year anniversary of women’s ordination in the ELCA and in honor of our Seminarians: Anne Palma, Dawn Busch and Mia Crosthwaite. \$65
- ♦ The proposed distribution for 2020 was \$250 and \$55 remains to be awarded to a new initiative at ILC during 2020.

On behalf of the contributors to the Fund, grants help to further new initiatives at Immanuel as well as partner with other groups to expand our outreach in Ada County, across the United States, and internationally. The Endowment Fund demonstrates our commitment to furthering God’s work.

Endowments get their funds primarily from legacy gifts. As you create your own legacy, we hope you’ll consider planning a gift to Immanuel. Supporting our Endowment Fund is one of the best ways you have to ensure that Immanuel’s mission will thrive for years to come. The Endowment Fund allows us to recognize the good things that have occurred in our life as a result of our faith.

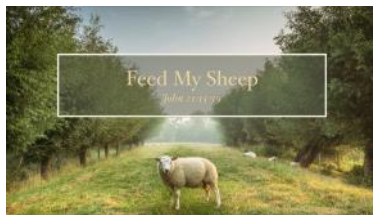

Church Council Update

Council Members: Les Gieselman-President, Barb Schmidt-Vice President, Renee Bergquist-Secretary, Lynn Clark-Treasurer, Pastor Gretchen Bingea, Lynnette Chandler, Tracie Johnson, Richard Keplinger, Jo Stensaas and Andrew White.

The Council met Monday, February 10, 2020, at 5:30 PM. Below is a recap of the meeting, pending Council approval:

- Approved Consent Agenda including Council Meeting Agenda (02/10/20), Council Meeting Minutes (1/13/20 & 1/26/20), Congregational Meeting Minutes (01/26/20), Pastor's Monthly Report, Committee Reports for Finance, Memorial, Property, Worship and Music, and Church Attendance Report.
- Carolyn Korn, Parish Administrator, with Matt Christman, provided a walkthrough of the Church Lock Up process. Carolyn also provided an update on Council access to Dropbox, ILC's Document Repository system.
- Reviewed and approved December 2019 and January 2020 Financial Reports.
- Reviewed January 31, 2020 MIF loan balance, Capital Campaign and current gap between funds given/pledged and the final project cost. As of January 31, 2020, \$5,347 additional funds required, including Interest, to pay off the loan by January 2021. Council discussed reducing the reserve for one year of loan payments by one month each month as we progress through the year.
- Postponed Acoustic Alchemy 6-month review to give new Council members time to experience a concert.
- Approved Memorial Committee request to spend Memorial Funds up to \$310 to purchase crosses and tablecloths for the Fellowship Hall.
- Social Ministry Committee is conducting a quilt raffle through February 17, 2020 to raise money for the RX Prescription program and planning Baby Steps drive in May.
- Accepted the recommendation of the Linden House Advisory Team to further explore with the Congregation, Option 2 – Long-Term Lease of Linden House with LEAP Charities.
- Council will attend Treasure Valley Cluster Council Retreat (3/14/2020) and agreed to highlight our Food Fellowship Ministry.
- Council agreed to offer Leadership and Healthy Congregations Module #3 Workshop led by Pastor Jim Grunow this Spring.
- Approved proposed Human Resources Committee Members: Nancy Upchurch (Chair), Dick Chilcote, Doug Dockter, Mike Schmidt, Don Stensaas, and Andrew White (HR Committee Liaison).
- Approved proposed Governing Documents Task Force Members: Dick Chilcote, Barb Condon, Jan Gieselman, and Nancy Upchurch.
- Approved Signatory Authority for Les Gieselman, President; Barb Schmidt, Vice President; Lynn Clark, Treasurer; Val Hanks, Financial Secretary and Andrew White, Council Member and Acoustic Alchemy Council Liaison.
- Approved request for LED to use Augustana and Immanuel for a promotional video and Council will approve finished product before it is released.
- Approved new members who will be welcomed into the Congregation on February 23, 2020.
- Next Council meeting is March 16, 2020, Immanuel Lower Level Conference Room.
