The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday March 6th. Since the Middle Ages it became the custom to begin Lent by being marked in ash with the sign of the cross. That sign of our mortality—that we are dust and to dust we shall return—also reminds us to turn to God who heals our brokenness and gives us life. That turning to God is the work of Lent. Six weeks we turn to God to renew our spirits and to re-set our lives. Roman Catholic sister Joyce Rupp writes in her book *Fresh Bread* that the season of Lent is an opportunity to find something of value which we've lost—to find what is missing in our lives that's been tossed away or misplaced or ignored, so that our lives can once again reflect the good news which Jesus encouraged us to live. And so she poses some questions about treasures that may need finding:

- Have I lost a sense of purpose in my life? What are my dreams and my hopes?
- Have I lost a belief in myself and my inner goodness? Do I truly care for my body and spirit?
- Have I lost a generous heart, open to the cares of others?
- Have I lost a sensitivity to God's presence in my life? Do I run through the days without pause for reflection and gratitude?
- Have I lost my perception of the truth? Do little lies creep into my life?
- Does my spirit allow for the gift of laughter? Have I lost the ability to laugh occasionally at myself and at life?
- Have I lost my intimacy with God? Do I still know Jesus?

If any of these questions resonate with you, I invite you to keep Lent this year—through worship, prayer, fellowship, study and service (see page 2 for some ideas). May each of us individually, and as a community of faith together, return to God to discover the treasures that lie within the abundant life Jesus came to bring us.

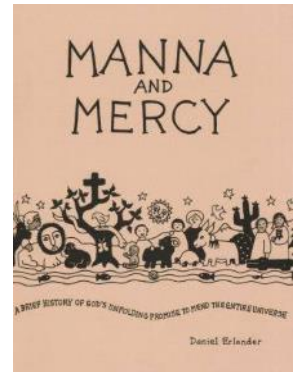

Lenten Wednesday Night Gatherings March 13-April 10

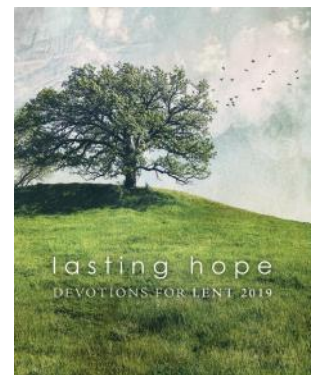

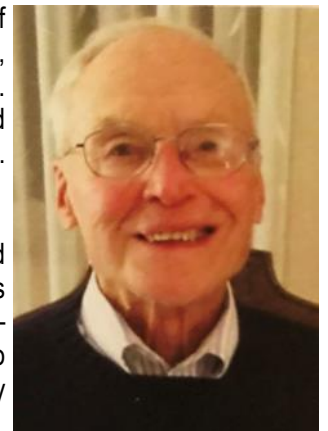

The Gift

Peter Marshall writes, "Those we love are with the Lord, and the Lord has promised to be with us. If they are with Him and He is with us, they cannot be far away". As our name, Immanuel reminds us, God is with us and we can take comfort in knowing our brother in Christ, Rod Miller, is not far away. Rod was a true steward of God's love. He loved his family, he loved his community, he loved life, and he loved Immanuel. He was a true example of faith as he brought others together to share God's love. Rod passed away in January 2018 and Immanuel recently received an abundant gift from his estate.

Rod's generous gift allows us to reduce our Mission Investment Fund Loan balance by \$120,000 and also immediately reduces the interest we will pay over the term of the loan. Our loan balance today is \$401,000 and we expect this balance to grow to approximately \$485,000 with the remaining construction costs. We have reserved \$80,000 to pay on the loan and with pledges of \$184,000 still expected to be received over the next two years; we expect to reduce our remaining loan balance to approximately \$110,000.



This gift and the gifts of others means payments on the loan should end more quickly, making way for the new missions we envision, to be implemented sooner. We are incredibly blessed with the generosity of our congregation and friends and the legacy of those who have come before us. God is with us! What a joy to see God's love at work helping us to fulfill our purpose "to share God's gift of love with all!"

Church Council Update

Les Gieselman-President, Barb Schmidt-Vice President, Renee Bergquist-Secretary, Richard Keplinger-Treasurer, Andrew White, Linda von Tagen, Jo Stensaas, Matt Christman and Pastor Gretchen Bingea.

The Council met Monday, February 4, 2019 at 5:30pm. Below is a recap of the meeting:

- The Preliminary Finance Report was reviewed for January and the trend is normal.
- There was an update on the ReJuv Project construction, missing equipment, budget, change orders, costs, Capital Campaign, loan status and a special \$120,000 gift received.
- Council approved the use the \$120,000 gift to pay down the MIF Construction loan principal.
- Over 50 responses to the Pastoral Review Survey have been received and feedback will be provided to Pastor Gretchen in March. Council discussed the process and process improvements to be considered for future reviews.
- The actions at Annual Congregational Meeting were reviewed for action.
- The Council Retreat (Hope Lutheran, Eagle, February 9, 2019 at 10:00am) was discussed.
- Barb Schmidt was appointed as Immanuel's representative on the Idaho Interfaith Roundtable Against Hunger (IIRAH).
- Installation of new Council Members and Synod representatives will be February 10.
- Next meeting is March 11, 2019, 5:30 PM, Immanuel Library.
