

What to Bring and What Not to Bring

This is not a comprehensive list, but an idea to start your personalized packing list.

Bed area:

Mattress pad
Extra-long twin sheets
Bed pillows
Blankets/throws
Comforter or bed-in-a-bag
Floor pillows/backrest
Slippers

Desk area:

Backpack
Calculator
Calendar/planner
Cell phone and charger
Desk lamp and light bulbs (No halogen)
Wastebasket
Flashlight
UL- listed grounded power strip with built-in fuse or circuit breaker (extension cords are not permitted)

Personal supplies:

Laundry detergent and laundry basket
Personal hygiene items
Prescription and non-prescription medication
Shower caddy/bucket
Shower shoes/sandals
Towels/washcloths

In addition to your regular wardrobe:

Business casual and professional clothing (i.e. button-down shirts, dress pants, shoes, suit, etc.)
Heavy winter coat
Boots (rain/snow)
Gloves, hat, earmuffs

Also consider: Coaxial cable for TV connection, laundry drying rack, fan

Check with your roommate before you bring: Refrigerator (less than 5 cubic feet), microwave (less than 1,000 watts), television, video game systems

High-heat appliances (irons, coffee makers, hot-air popcorn makers, and other similar devices, including Keurigs) are permitted provided they are UL-approved and used in the manner intended

Please DO NOT Bring:

- Large appliances, including air conditioners
- Cooking appliances-ovens, hotplates, toasters, toasters ovens, crockpots, grills (including "George Foreman-type" grills), and other similar devices
- Space heaters
- Candles, incense, etc.
- Wall mounted TVs (only free standing TVs are permitted)
- Firearms, weapons, and fireworks
- General purpose extension cords. ALL general purpose extension cords (even UL-approved) are prohibited; only UL-listed grounded power strips with built-in fuse circuit breaker are permitted.
- Halogen lamps and multi-headed floor lamps
- Large pieces of furniture
- Pets
- Expensive or irreplaceable collectibles or jewelry.
