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WELCOME

Welcome to Saint Clement's Church in this joyous Eastertide. If you are new or newish, please feel fill out the card in your bulletin and drop it in the offering plate. Also, we won't ask you to stand up and introduce yourself or anything else embarrassing.

If you are unfamiliar with the manner in which Episcopalians worship, not to worry: just relax and let the Liturgy and your senses carry you as it is celebrated. Commonly recited texts are found in the red **Book of Common Prayer** and hymns found in the blue **Hymnal 1982** and **Lift Every Voice and Sing II**. At the time of the administration of Holy Communion, all are welcome to receive regardless of religious affiliation if any. Saint Clements is an "Anglo-Catholic" parish so you might find the Liturgy a bit more elaborate than other Episcopal Churches.

Join us after the Liturgy downstairs as our fellowship continues with *Coffee Hour*. Restrooms are located downstairs on the far side of the Parish Hall to the right. Again, welcome.

THE INTERCESSION BOOK, to which you're welcome to add your prayers in writing to be offered during Mass, is in the front at the Shrine of Our Lady of Africa. The **Regina Cæli** is offered at 10.20a at the same place.





 We await his coming in glory.






THE LORD'S PRAYER


