Commonly recited texts are found in the red Book of Common Prayer and hymns found in the blue Hymnal 1982 and Lift Every Voice and Sing II At the time of the administration of Holy Communion, all are welcome to receive regardless of religious affiliation if any. Saint Clements is an "Anglo-Catholic" parish so you might find the Liturgy a bit more elaborate than other Episcopal Churches. Join us after the Liturgy downstairs as our fellowship continues with Coffee Hour. Restrooms are located downstairs on the far side of the Parish Hall to the right. Again, welcome.

We remember his death,


We proclaim his resurrection,

# THE FRACTION: THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD




