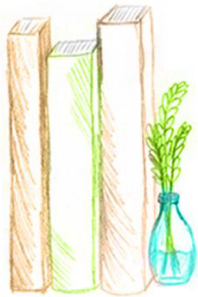

Our Stone Walls - What They Are and Where They Are Going.

Sylvia Reiss spoke to a standing room only crowd on the subject of New England stone walls. Would you ever imagine that the subject of stone walls could be funny? Not only was Ms. Reiss very knowledgeable on the subject, she kept us laughing through the entire program!



We learned how stone walls came to be, the names of different types of stone walls, what makes a great stone wall, and more. Ms. Reiss spoke with admiration about a particular stone wall right here in New Canaan, built by Antonio Vitti. Did you know that our own Lee Memorial Garden has a grouping of rocks left from glacier movement? The rocks are beautiful any time of the year, but in the winter, they lie more exposed showing off the lichen and moss that grace their surfaces.
