*All The Presidents' Gardens* tells the untold history of the White House grounds. With wit and insight, garden historian Marta McDowell traces the fascinating story of how our presidents and their families have left their imprint upon the eighteen acres surrounding the executive mansion.

Marta McDowell lives, gardens, and writes in Chatham, New Jersey. She writes and lectures on gardening topics and teaches landscape history and horticulture at the New York Botanical Garden, where she studied landscape design. She also consults for public gardens and private clients. Some of the books she's authored include *Beatrix Potter's Gardening Life*, *The World of Laura Ingalls Wilder*, *Emily Dickinson's Gardens*, and *All the Presidents' Gardens*.
