

A bit of Lee Garden History:

George Lee ran a nursery he called 'The Mouse Trap Nursery'.

From a 1975 Plant Sale leaflet from George's Mousetrap Nursery annual sale, we find this entry under Evergreen Azaleas:

"Stewartstonian. Gable Azalea. The only pure, fire engine red. Lovely out of flower with dark, polished, small leaves, turning bronze during the winter. A great favorite of men who don't care what color an azalea is as long as it is bright red."

Also, in same leaflet:

"Epimedium. Too little known or used. Excellent edging plant or for covering large area with attractive lacy foliage. Many different forms and colors which will be offered before long. This year we have a small white form, (E. youngianum niveum) and the large form either red or yellow flowers (E. x rubrum and E. x versicolor sulphureum).
