It was an hour of grace for the whole world - mercy triumph over justice. Maybe you're at work, at home, at adoration. Do you take a moment to thank Him for what he's done for you? (1572)

Whoever will recite the chaplet will receive great Mercy at the time of death. Even if he were a sinner most hardened and were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from his infinite Mercy. (687)

Pray the Chaplet for a dying person to receive unfathomable mercy to envelope their soul. If only everyone realized how great the Lord's mercy is and how much we all need that mercy, especially at that crucial hour. (811)

Happy is the soul that during his lifetime immerse himself in the fountain of mercy because justice will have no hold on it. (1075)

Tell the world about His mercy and love. Spread the devotion to His mercy. Snuggle close to His merciful heart and He will fill it with peace. (1074)
