



Annual Investigator Meeting: Guidelines for Abstract Submission

Abstract Guidelines

Title: Should be concise, active and as informative as possible (that is, rather than just “studies on pancreatic islets” or “the role of x in y”, for example, it should be a conclusion-oriented title). Then followed by authors and institutions – individual presenting if selected to **bolded**.

Abstract: Should cover three areas. Minimize repetition between segments.

1. Background:

- A. What problem are you addressing? (1-2 sentences)
- B. What is the significance to islet biology – the large gap that it is intending to fill? (1-2 sentences)

2. Methodology and concise findings, stressing new techniques, and trying to reduce technical jargon or explain it at a higher level:

- A. How did you address this area? (1-3 sentences)
- B. What findings did you have? (5-6 sentences)

3. Conclusions and impact to your field, and to the HIRN in general:

- A. What you can conclude, specifically, and describe its impact. (1-3 sentences)

Then:

- (i) Citations (not required, suggested 3-5 max)
- (ii) Funding acknowledgements (including non-HIRN support if appropriate)

Requirements

- Length: 500 word maximum
- Font: ARIAL 11
- Margin: 1”
- Do not include images/visuals
- File uploaded must be word-based (e.g. .doc, .docx)
- Include author last name in file name
