



The Lessons

FIRST READING:

Acts 11:1-18

The people sit.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

The apostles and the brothers and sisters throughout Judea heard that even the Gentiles had welcomed God's word. When Peter went up to Jerusalem,

the circumcised believers criticized him. They accused him, "You went into the home of the uncircumcised and ate with them!"

Step-by-step, Peter explained what had happened. "I was in the city of Joppa praying when I had a visionary experience. In my vision, I saw something like a large linen sheet being lowered from heaven by its four corners. It came all the way down to me. As I stared at it, wondering what it was, I saw four-legged animals—including wild beasts—as well as reptiles and wild birds. I heard a voice say, 'Get up, Peter! Kill and eat!' I responded, 'Absolutely not, Lord! Nothing impure or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' The voice from heaven spoke a second time, 'Never consider unclean what God has made pure.' This happened three times, then everything was pulled back into heaven. At that moment three men who had been sent to me from Caesarea arrived at the house where we were staying. The Spirit told me to go with them even though they were Gentiles. These six brothers also went with me, and we entered that man's house. He reported to us how he had seen an angel standing in his house and saving. 'Send to Joppa and summon Simon, who is known as Peter. He will tell you how you and your entire household can be saved.' When I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell on them, just as the Spirit fell on us in the beginning. I remembered the Lord's words: 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If God gave them the same gift he gave us who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, then who am I? Could I stand in God's way?" Once the apostles and other believers heard this, they calmed down. They praised God and concluded, "So then God has enabled Gentiles to change their hearts and lives so that they might have new life."


A Reading from the Revelation to John.



MEDITATION

Sacramental Journey Students

Please join with our students by saying the words in bold.

Adrian and Morgan: The sacraments are important gifts from Jesus.

Everyone: Our Sacramental Journey starts here. We are united with Jesus in Holy Baptism.

Morgan: This is the water (pour water into the font). It washes away our sin and gives us new life in Jesus.

Adrian: This is the Chrism. It is consecrated oil. It represents the strength of the Holy Spirit. With it we are sealed by the Holy Spirit in baptism and marked as Christ's own forever.

Morgan: This is the Paschal candle. It represents the light of Christ. At Baptism, we are given a candle to carry the light of Christ into the world.

Everyone: Our journey continues with the sacrament of Holy Eucharist. We are nourished and strengthened by Jesus in the Eucharist.

The students move to the altar

Everyone: This is the altar, the table of the Lord

Adrian: This is the Fair Linen It's like a tablecloth

Morgan: These are the candles **The light of Christ**

Adrian: This is the chalice **A cup for the wine**

Morgan: This is the paten **A plate for the bread**

Adrian: This is the bread, also called the Priest Host: **The Body of Christ**. **It is big enough for all to see**

Morgan: This is the water in the cruet **It reminds us of baptism**

Adrian: This is the wine in the cruet **The blood of Christ**

Everyone: Our church has Deacons. They make sure the poor, the sick, the weak, and the lonely are included at the table.

Everyone: This is our priest. She ministers so that the love of Jesus may be known and received at the font and the table. We are all the people of God who celebrate together in Holy Communion!

The Congregation responds: Amen!

BLESSING OF THE WATER

All children and youth are invited to gather at the Baptismal font with our Sacramental Journey class for a prayer and blessing of the water. All return to their places for the Creed.

THE CREED

All stand.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,

and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

INVITATION

The Presider invites the people to Communion with these or similar words:

Wherever you are on your journey, you are welcome at God's table.

The Gifts of God for the People of God.

To receive the Sacrament, come forward in two lines down the center aisle, to either the main altar or the chapel altar rail. Please fill in all the spaces along the rail. Standing or kneeling, hold out your hands. The minister will place the bread in your palm. You may then receive the wine by drinking from the larger cup or intincting (dipping) the bread in the smaller cup. If you do not wish to receive the wine, cross your arms across your chest as the cup bearers come to you. If you would prefer a blessing, come forward to the rail, cross your arms across your chest, and the minister will bless you.

At the main altar, once you have received, stand and exit through the side door closest to you (either left past the organ or right through the choir room) to walk around and back into the sanctuary, using the side aisles to return to your seat.
