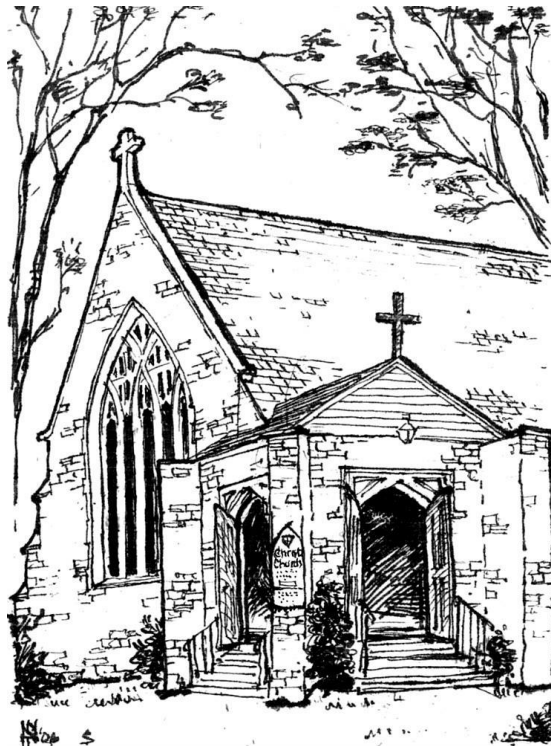

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.

Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.**

### **INVITATION**

*The Presider invites the people to Communion with these or similar words:*

Behold what we are. May we become what we receive.

The Gifts of God for the People of God.

*To receive the Sacrament, come forward in two lines down the center aisle, to either the main altar or the chapel altar rail. Please fill in all the spaces along the rail. Standing or kneeling, hold out your hands. The minister will place the bread in your palm. You may then receive the wine by drinking from the larger cup or intincting (dipping) the bread in the smaller cup. If you do not wish to receive the wine, cross your arms across your chest as the cup bearers come to you. If you would prefer a blessing, come forward to the rail, cross your arms across your chest, and the minister will bless you.*

*At the main altar, once you have received, stand and exit through the side door closest to you (either left past the organ or right through the choir room) to walk around and back into the sanctuary, using the side aisles to return to your seat.*

**Summer Sunday Worship Schedule Changes** - Starting June 23, Christ Church will transition to our summer worship schedule. We warmly invite you to join us for our Saturday service of Holy Eucharist at 5pm or Sunday service of Holy Eucharist at 9am.

Following the Sunday 9am service, we will be gathering for a delightful tradition: Lemonade on the Lawn. This is more than just refreshments; it's an opportunity to mingle, connect, and bask in the sunshine together. We'd love to see you there!

**Church School News** - We are looking forward to welcoming back our Church School students this fall! There are a few important updates to share:

- Donna Eby is stepping down after completing her term as Interim Church School Coordinator. Her contribution to this program has been incredible and she stepped up to lead this program to make sure it would thrive after Johnna Frederickson moved to VT. Her passion for the youth of Christ Church is extraordinary and we look forward to her participation in other ways during the school year and beyond.
- Su D'Ambrosio is stepping up to be the Church School Coordinator this year
- Becky Metzger is stepping up to pilot a new youth program for students in grades 6-12
- **New Church School Schedule!** After much discussion and prayer we are adjusting the class times for Church School to make it possible for families and Church School volunteers to attend church together regularly and provide a more engaging program for our older students. The new schedule is:
  - Grades PreK-5: Sunday 9:00 AM to 9:45 AM
  - Opportunities for older students and adults from 9-9:45 AM: All adults and older students are invited to participate in faith formation discussion with Rev. Melissa. These sessions are designed to include Lectionary-based themes which can facilitate parent connection with the curriculum we are using with PreK-5. Adults and older students are also welcome to join choir rehearsal or enjoy coffee and quiet time before church!
- **Youth Group for Grades 6-12:** Becky Metzger is leading a youth group which features:
  - A pizza/movie night on Fridays and discussion related to the movie and faith formation on Sundays. Students will meet once per month alternating Friday and Sunday sessions.
  - An opportunity for these students to connect in a fun/social environment
  - A dedicated youth formation Church School time for this age group that allows them to participate more fully in church services.
  - The potential for planning a mission trip at some point.
  - Expansion on the "off weeks" to include Confirmation Class when we have students to participate.

We currently have students in grades 6-9 only. As this group expands we will group students accordingly (6-8/9-12).

The first day of Church School for PreK-5 is Sunday, September 8. We will have class at 9 AM and a special Welcome Back Ice Cream Social at Coffee Hour!

Volunteers assist the lead teacher with class activities and ensure that we adhere to minimum adult supervision requirements for Safe Church guidelines.
