HISTORY OF IABA

- ▶ The Islamic Ahlul Bayt Association (IABA) of Austin, Texas was founded in 1997
- ▶ It is the only Ithna 'Ashari organization in the greater Austin area
- ▶ At current location since 2002 (former Baptist church on 4.1 acres)
- ▶ Multi-ethnic membership of 450:
 - ▶ U.S., Afghanistan, Iran, Iraq, Lebanon, Qatar, Pakistan, India, East Africa, and more
 - ▶ 5% annual growth
- ▶ English is the official language for all IABA programs



CITY OF AUSTIN

- ▶ Capital of Texas, located in Central Texas
- ▶ 11th largest city in the U.S., and 4th largest in Texas
- ▶ Metro area population approximately 2.2 million
- ▶ One of the fastest-growing cities; consistently ranked one of the best places to live and work in the U.S.
- ▶ Major Industries:
 - ▶ Technology hub of the south: Software, Hardware, Systems, and Biotechnology
 - ▶ Pharmaceutical
 - ▶ State Government and Education
- ▶ Home of the University of Texas (best public university in Texas), a premier research facility bringing students from all over the world for Master's / Ph.D.

GOVERNANCE

- ▶ Constitution and By-Laws in place since 1997
- ▶ 7-Member Executive Committee
- ▶ Executive Committee elections held every two years (two-year staggered terms)
- ▶ Executive Committee meetings open to all paid members
- ▶ Appointed officers serve as Chairs of sub-committees, such as: Education, Program, Youth, Building, Fundraising, Funeral, Outreach, and Welfare

Member: Amer Allami



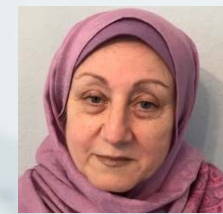

- ▶ Religious programs for Wiladat and Shahadat of Masoomeen
- ▶ Muharram and Arbaeen programs
- ▶ Month long programs during Ramadan, with pot luck Iftar on weekdays and full sponsored Iftar on weekends and Nights of Qadr
- ▶ Eid prayers
- ▶ Thursday night Du'a Kumayl and Ziyarat Waritha
- ▶ Friday Jummah prayers
- ▶ Lectures by Resident Aalim on Saturday evenings followed by sponsored community dinner
- ▶ Friday night youth activities



MADRASAH

- ▶ KG through 8th grade weekend classes in Islamic Studies & Quran
- ▶ 90+ students, ages 5 to 15
- ▶ All-volunteer faculty of 31 teachers, with a Principal and Vice Principal
- ▶ Arabic language classes also offered
- ▶ Older youth Halaqa
- ▶ Adult education



ADULT ISLAMIC EDUCATION

- ▶ Track record of producing young scholars from within:
 - ▶ Eight former community members have gone on to Hawzah study in Chicago (Bait-ul-Ilm Academy) or Iran (Qom Seminary)
- ▶ IABA is playing a crucial role in helping university and high school students learn more about Islam and take pride in their Islamic identity!

- ▶ Chair: Sister Sabika Bharmal
- ▶ Youth committee organizes Friday night youth activities (e.g., sports nights, youth Halaqas with Sheikh Jafar and other visiting scholars, etc.)
- ▶ Special events include, e.g.:
 - ▶ Recently, an evening campfire with hot chocolate, snacks, and informal Q & A session with our very own visiting youth scholar Azhar Sheraze (Bait-ul-Ilm Academy in Chicago)
 - ▶ Annual Candlelight Vigil on the eve of Ashura (Quran, poetry, speech, noha/latmiya, and ziyarat entirely organized by youth of various ages)
 - ▶ Youth boating trip to the near by lake



OUTREACH COMMITTEE

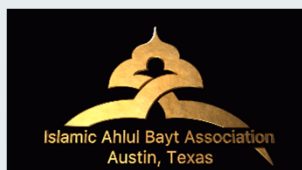
- ▶ Chair: Dr. Syed Hasan Akhtar
- ▶ Committee works with different faith groups:
 - ▶ Interfaith Action of Central Texas (IACT), Church without Walls, Muslim Community Support Services (MCSS), and individual churches and temples
 - ▶ Conducts Da'wah activities through sharing Qurans and other literature
 - ▶ Hosts other faith groups to attend Ramadan iftar at IABA, as well as attend other special events
 - ▶ Recently co-sponsored Milad-un-Nabi (s.a.w.) celebrations with Muslim Space (an umbrella Muslim group in Austin), to promote intra-faith harmony
- ▶ Committee has conducted an annual holiday Cookie Drive around the neighborhood of the mosque for the past 4 years now. Volunteers bake and deliver cookies wrapped in holiday packages to our neighbors. In 2018, about 1,000 cookies were baked by volunteers, and delivered to 200 homes in the neighborhood, including a nearby retirement home



Dr. Syed Hasan Akhtar has been an active member of IABA since 2000, and is current Chair of the Outreach Committee. He is a frequent writer and speaker on Islamic da'wah and interfaith topics, and has published two books and many short articles.

WELFARE COMMITTEE

- Led by Sheikh Jafar and other members of the community including the IABA President
- Committee is responsible for distributing funds to needy Muslims in the Greater Austin area
- Actively helping out the influx of Iraqi refugees that have settled in the Austin area
- Also holds campaigns to collect and send funds to Muslims in need all over the world:
 - Collected over \$10,000 for Rohingya relief
 - Collected over \$10,000 for Yemen relief
- With the generous support of the community, the Committee has distributed the following funds to needy Muslims:
 - Over \$37,000 in 2017
 - Over \$40,000 in 2018



IABA VISION

- ▶ Establish a great learning place for all ages:
 - ▶ Top notch Saturday Madrasah for children
 - ▶ Adult Islamic education, e.g., advanced classes in Fiqh, Arabic, Quran, and Hadith
 - ▶ Create a scholars exchange program with Chicago's Bait-ul-Ilm Academy
- ▶ Maintain the unity IABA has enjoyed within our multi-cultural, multi-ethnic community
- ▶ Be a beacon of Islamic values in Austin and the surrounding area, with generosity, hospitality, and openness to all
- ▶ Become a leader and host for Interfaith and Intra-faith activities and projects in Austin
- ▶ Establish a true community center, where youth can also come to play sports, socialize, do homework, etc.

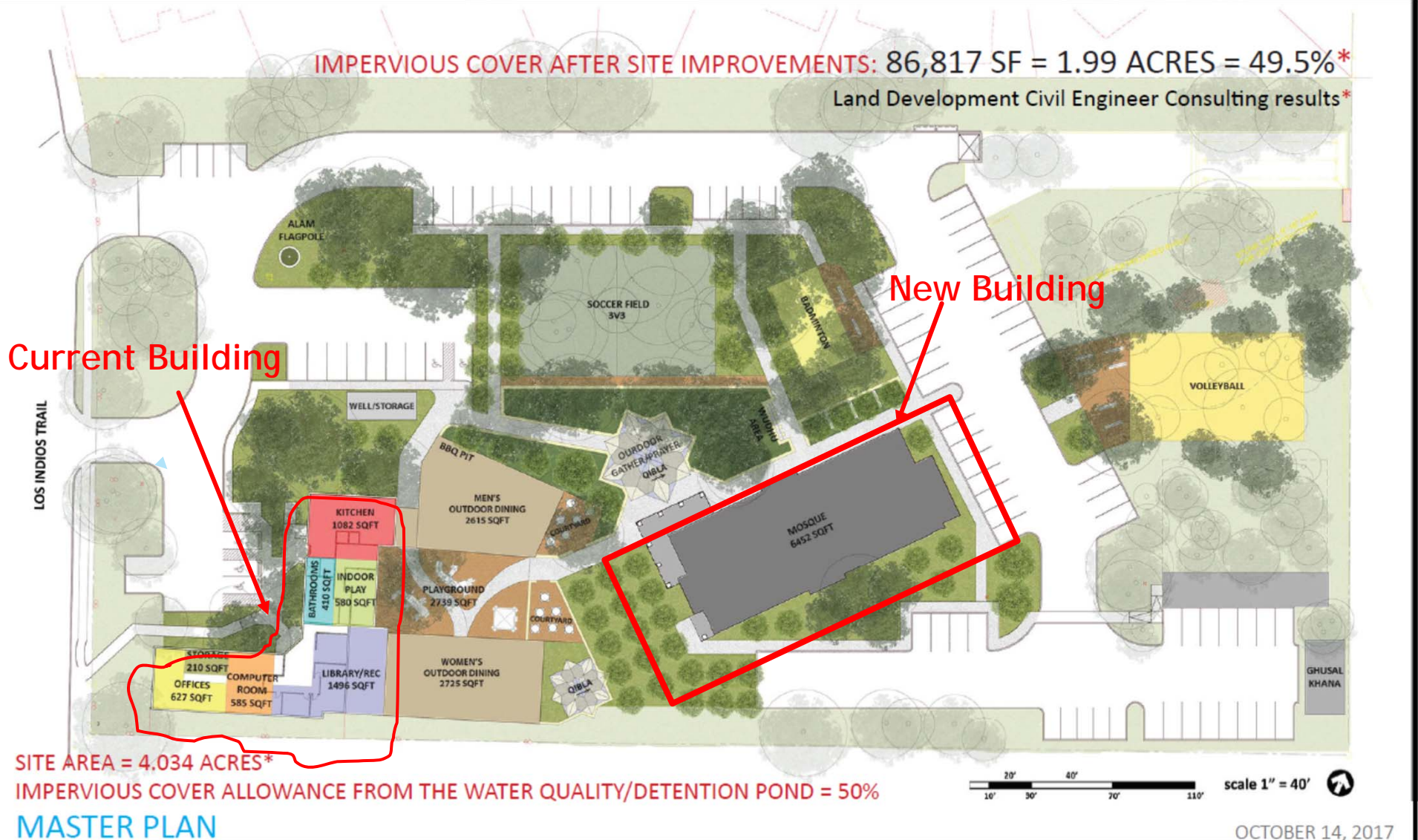


NEED FOR THE NEW BUILDING

- ▶ Community has outgrown the current space of one congregation hall with partition (jamaat prayers on big gathering nights cannot fit all in the hall)
- ▶ Need proper classrooms for Madrasah students (many classes being held in one hall with makeshift partitions)
- ▶ Need proper all-weather dining facility (current makeshift outdoor tent for dining)
- ▶ Need proper sports facilities and gathering place for youth
- ▶ Need a proper library space for good collection of books on Islam and other religions/topics



PROPOSED MASTER PLAN FOR THE SITE



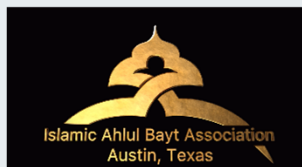


BUILDING HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ Total area: 12,600 sq. ft.
- ▶ Two-story building:
 - ▶ Prayer/lecture hall on ground floor
 - ▶ 10 classrooms/library on upper floor
- ▶ Parking lot, retention pond, utility lines, and landscape done in 2014 (\$850,000)
- ▶ Building permit approved
- ▶ Projected total remaining cost for Project: \$2.6M*



*Cost includes development of the master plan: Building, Eating Pavilion, Playgrounds, Kitchen

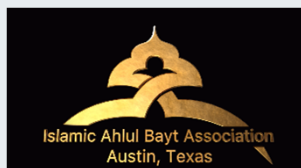


FINANCIALS

- ▶ Funds already raised from within the community:
 - ▶ \$1.0 M
- ▶ Target: raise another \$0.8-\$1.0M from within the community, Insha'Allah
- ▶ Need: Another \$0.6-0.8M in fundraising from outside the community to complete the project
