

# FERAL CAT RESOURCES

**REQUEST.** To request that volunteers come and Trap, Neuter, Release (TNR) the cats in your area, the Animal Defense League of Arizona has a form on their website that you can fill out to request these services. *\*It is \$25/cat for the surgical procedure.*

**VOLUNTEER.** The Animal Defense League of Arizona and Foundation for Homeless Cats are always looking for volunteers. Both organizations have volunteer forms on their websites and a list of where they need volunteers. If there is enough interest in our district we can form a feral cat neighborhood alliance.
