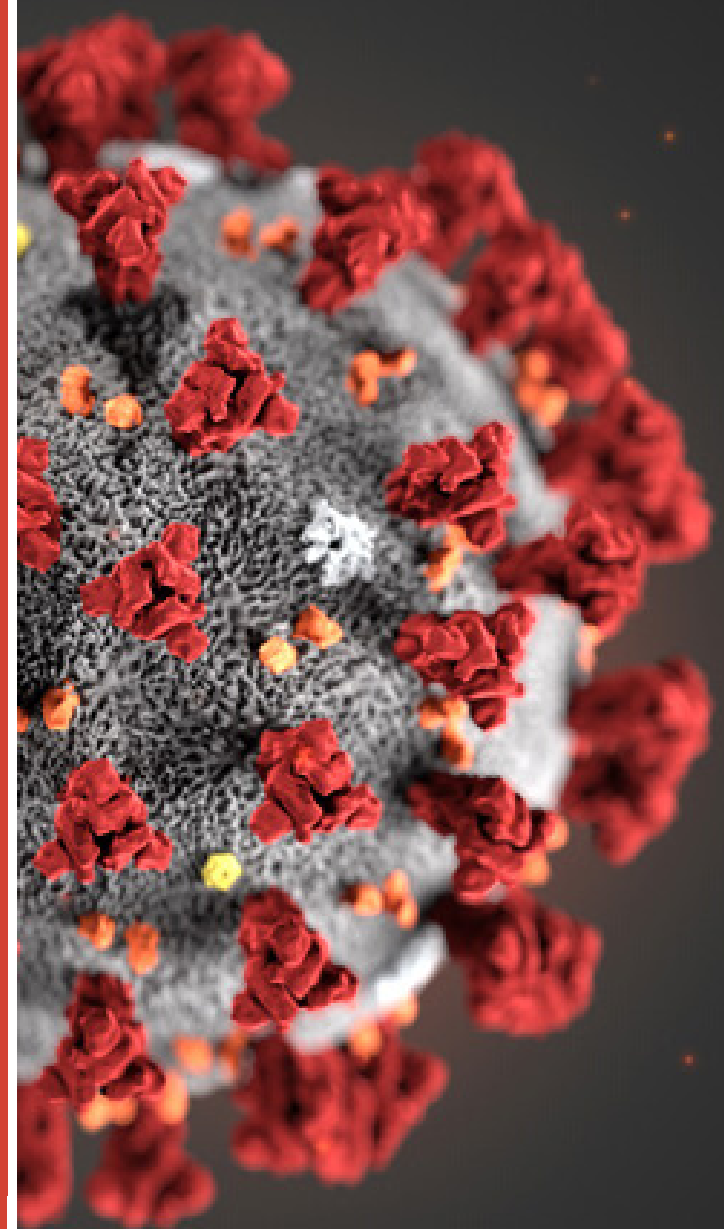

GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER

All Arizonans shall stay at home whenever possible through April 30th, 2020, except to conduct or participate in essential activities and functions including work.

EXCEPTIONS:

To conduct or participate in essential activities.

For employment, to volunteer in essential functions.

To utilize any services or products provided by essential businesses.

Employment, if as a sole proprietor or family owned business, work is conducted in a separate office space from your home and the business is not open to serve the public.

No person shall be required to provide documentation or proof of their activities to justify their activities under this order.



Please stay home for your health care workers and first responders. We work to take care of you, please stay home for us.

Violations of the Governor's Executive Order are a class one misdemeanor under A.R.S. 26-317. We ask the public to comply with the order. Law enforcement will work primarily to educate the public when possible as primary method of enforcement.

THE SIMPLE ANSWER IS **NO.**

ESSENTIAL ACTIVITIES

Shopping for food and supplies.

Seeking medical/mental health, emergency services, medical supplies and medication.

Caring for pets and family members in another household or residence.

Engaging in outdoor activities, such as walking, hiking, running, biking, or golfing, must maintain physical distances.

Working, attending or volunteering in an essential function.

Engaging in constitutionally protected activities and any legal or court process.

Individuals shall limit the use of public transportation to when absolutely necessary.

Homeless individuals are exempt from this Executive Order.
