
Since the beginning of the pandemic, I have strongly advocated for appropriate measures to maintain the health and well-being of Glendale's citizens and visitors. Yesterday, Governor Ducey issued Executive Order #2021-06, which rescinds the Face Covering Proclamation I signed in March 2020, as it pertains to private businesses and open spaces.

Although no longer required throughout the city, I am requiring the use of face coverings while inside of all City of Glendale government facilities until April 19, 2021, when our Glendale employees will have had the opportunity to be vaccinated. Please note that the CDC's federal mandate still requires the use of face coverings while traveling on public transit.

Getting vaccinated will help keep you, your family, and your community healthy and safe. By getting vaccinated, we can help end the damaging effects COVID has had on our economy while preventing illness and deaths in Arizona.

I ask you to take a fact-based approach to COVID-19 by continuing to visit Arizona's Department of Health Services ([www.azdhs.gov](http://www.azdhs.gov)) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ([www.cdc.gov](http://www.cdc.gov)) for up-to-date mitigation information.
