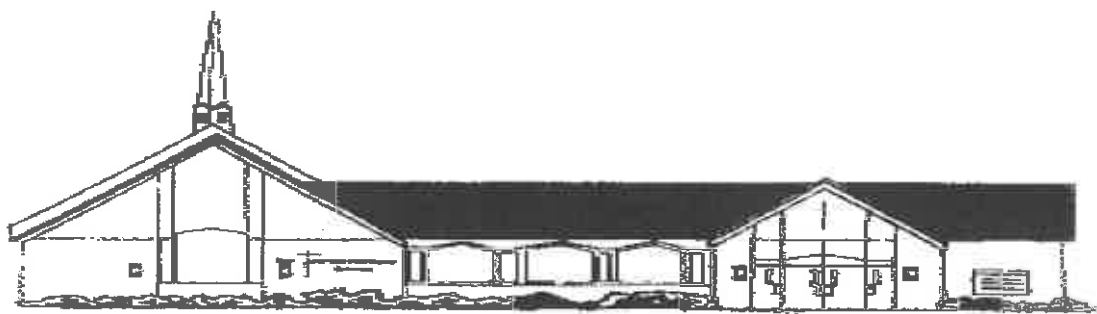

LAY SERVANT TRAINING:

November 15-16

Lay Servants serve the local church or charge in any way in which their witness, leadership, or service inspire other laity and clergy partners to a deeper commitment to Christ and more effective discipleship. There are a broad range of mission and ministry opportunities for lay people in the UMC! Courses being offered this fall:

- Basic Lay Servant | This course will equip participants to better lead and serve with others, not only in the church but also in the community and throughout the world.
- From Your Heart to Theirs | Participants will learn to find a story, use the hymnal, and move from communication on paper to beyond the paper.
- Lay Pastoral Care | This course offers insights into the lifespan and the dynamics of contemporary life to help church leaders reach out with God's love and care to others.
- Leading In Prayer | This course on praying in public will help the participants grow in confidence and skill in prayer, both public and personal.

FROM PK'S DESK:

2 Timothy 3: 14 - 16:

14 But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, 15 and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. 16 All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, 17 so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

Paul's message to Timothy here is telling Timothy to always be in a mindset of learning and to be looking for the opportunity to learn. I want to note one word from this part of the letter. "Reproof" Paul called Timothy to not only be learning but to also be reflecting on his life and to use the scripture as the standard to which we should hold ourselves to.

I will be honest I am not a person that wakes up at the crack of dawn, and I know how much "fun" it is to try to get kids ready in the morning. However, it is important to humbly admit that we are children of God no matter what age we are. We are called to be in constant learning about God as God reveals Godself to us. We have a great opportunity every week to learn, to be in fellowship, and to also be an example to the younger members of our congregation to participate in Sunday School classes. I pray that if you or your children are not attending our Sunday School class that you are finding other ways to be in learning and fellowship with our believers in your life. I also ask that you pray for our Sunday School teachers as they sacrifice personal time to prepare their lessons, and you pray for the conversations that are had in our Sunday School rooms.

OUR YOUTH AND 4-H: Genesis 1:24-26 reminds us that God has placed the care of the world and his creatures in our hands. 24 And God said, "Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind." And it was so. 25 God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good. 26 Then God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth."

We have many young members of our youth at Woodville United Methodist Church that do this through an organization called 4-H. Cameron, Kaylin, and Noah Day; Dillion and Lucy Fulweber; and Austin and Braden Reardon worked hard throughout the year caring for all types of livestock from goats, sheep, pigs, rabbits, chickens, and pheasants they provide for the animals daily needs. They then take the animals to the county fair to be judged on everything from the animal's appearance to showmanship. They are judged on how they care for the animals too. Cam took second place at the fair this year. Noah took first place on his market lamb and third place on his market chickens. Dillion took 4th place with his market pen of rabbits and 5th place in both his market pen of chickens and his poultry showmanship. Austin took 2nd place in his breed of rabbits. Braden is looking forward to hopefully showing his ringneck pheasants off at next year's fair. I want to congratulate all of our youth in their dedication to taking care of God's creatures and showing us what it takes to be committed!

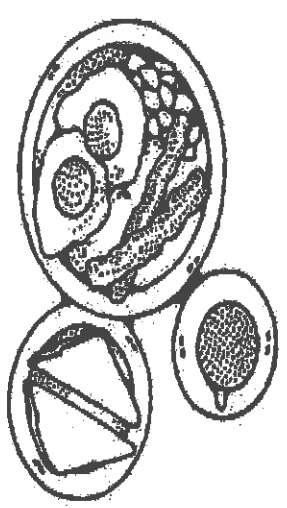
