

DePaul University's Holtschneider Performance Center Communication Access

DePaul staff will be on hand to distribute the receiver and selected headset and to help users know how to use the equipment.

There are three choices for connecting to the small receiver box:

Two that plug in to the receiver box: Earbuds (that insert in both ears for those without hearing aids), or a small receiver that hooks over the ear and sits alongside one ear.

One is a neck loop that slips on like a necklace and wirelessly conveys the signal to a hearing aid or cochlear implant switched to the T-coil setting.

Users will need to leave a driver's license or state ID card when picking up the equipment. These will be kept safely and returned to the user when the equipment is turned in at the end of the program. This is the standard procedure at auditoriums and theaters that provide communication access devices.
