City Recognizes Newly Ranked Eagle Scouts

At its March meeting the City Council recognized 11 young men from Boy Scout Troup 525 for attaining their Eagle Scout badge.

Eagle Scout is the highest rank awarded by the Boy Scouts of America and requires a demonstration of citizenship, leadership and personal responsibility. To earn this ranking the Scout must earn 21 merit badges; hold positions of leadership within his troop; successfully complete an approved Eagle Scout Service Project and successfully complete an Eagle Scout Board of Review.

Troop 525 was chartered in 1984 with eight boys, since its founding over 140 members achieved the rank of Eagle Scout including the 11 recognized by the city. The troop meets at Simpsonwood United Methodist Church in Peachtree Corners.
