Peachtree Corners Honors Its Vietnam Veterans

In a special event held last month, the [Peachtree Corners Veterans Monument Association](#) (PCBMA), in partnership with [NanoLumens](#), the [Witness to War Foundation](#) and the City of Peachtree Corners honored the community's Vietnam Veterans for their service and sacrifice.

Thirty-five Peachtree Corners veterans were recognized during an early evening event at the NanoLumens offices in Peachtree Corners. The event marked the city's participation in the Vietnam War Commemoration, a national effort to recognize and officially welcome home the more than 9 million Vietnam Veterans who served our country.

The Vietnam War Commemoration was authorized by Congress, established under the Secretary of Defense and launched by the President in May 2012, to recognize all men and women who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces from Nov. 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975.

As part of the evening events, [State of Georgia Veterans Service](#), Commissioner Mike Roby presented a certificate and lapel pin to each veteran.

"Too many Vietnam War Veterans never received proper recognition for their service to our country," said Commissioner Roby. "We believe it is never too late to say 'thank you' to these veterans. The Vietnam War Certificate of Honor is a small token of our great respect for their sacrifices."

Peachtree Corners is part of a grateful nation in thanking and honoring its Vietnam War Veterans, the fallen, the wounded, those who were held as Prisoners of War, and those listed as missing and unaccounted for.
