Did you know Peachtree Corners has an A+ grade on Niche.com, and it was ranked in the top 10 percent of the Best Places to Live in Georgia? Niche is a Pittsburgh-based company with employees throughout the country that focuses on helping people find the best places to live and go to school. Peachtree Corners was listed as the #5 most diverse place to live in Georgia, and it was deemed the #10 best suburb for young professionals out of 164.

Our efforts to improve quality of life for residents and attract employers is making a difference. We constructed the Town Center and have been offering free concerts for several years now, as well as other events, such as the annual festival. We expanded the popular play area for young people at the Town Green, which encourages fitness, and we are designing new trails throughout the city. All of these things make a difference in the city's livability and attractiveness to employers.
