

The Prayer for Light




Presider Let us pray.

Luke 24:36-53


Lector A Reading from the Gospel according to Luke.

While they were talking about this, Jesus stood among the disciples and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you-- that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things." And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

us from wildfire and disaster, bring us the rain and snow to refresh the land, give us the wisdom to be good stewards of the earth you have made, and the

courage to face climate change and other disasters of our own making.

Intercessor Receive all those who will draw their last breath this night –may they awake to

the light of eternal life and glory.

People Hear our prayer.

Intercessor Be with us all this night as we go to take our rest –may we awaken to new

possibilities and new life at the dawn.

People Hear our prayer.

Presider Grant us, Lord, the lamp of charity which never fails, that it may burn in us and

shed its light on those around us, and that by its brightness we may have a vision of that holy City, where dwells the true and never-failing Light, Jesus

Christ our Lord. Amen.
