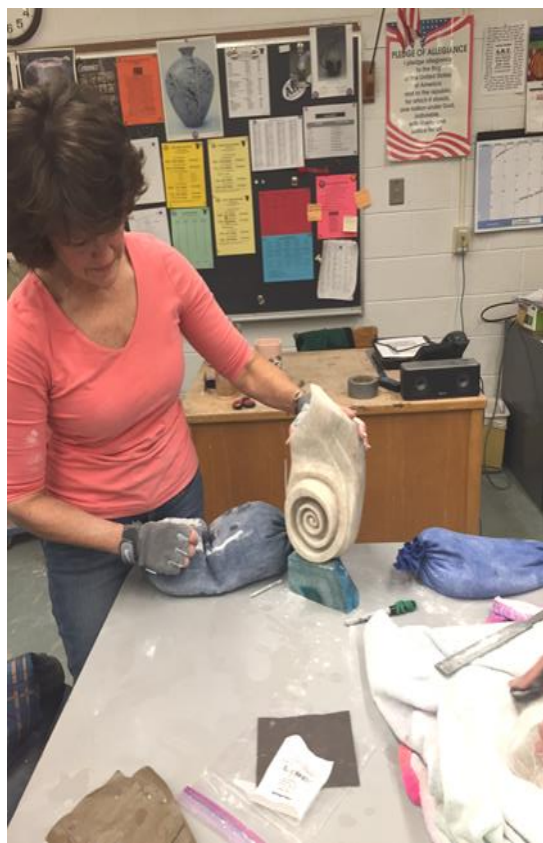

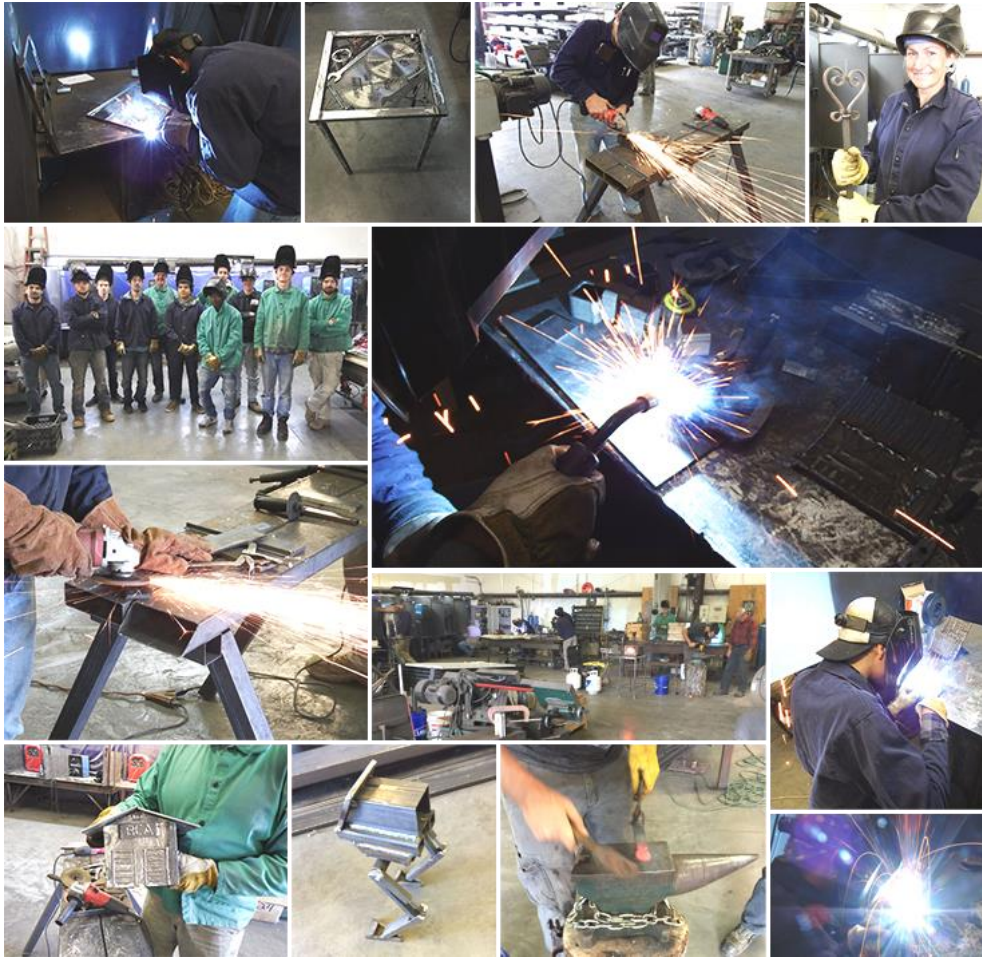

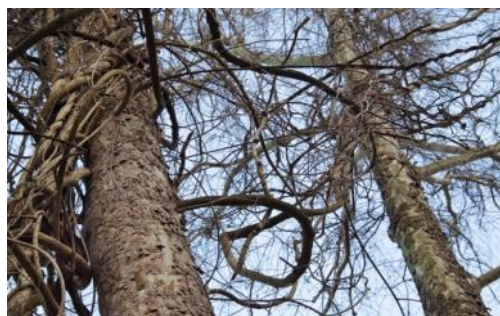

INVASIVE PLANT IDENTIFICATION AND TREATMENT METHODS



The pictures above are of oriental bittersweet, a vine that overtakes trees and opens the forest canopy.

Non-native invasive plants are quickly overwhelming many properties by tearing down the forest canopy and overtaking our native plants at the tree, shrub and/or groundcover levels. These plants are also overwhelming the ability of many landowners to understand what invasive plants exist on their land and what it will take to control them. These two identical sessions will cover:

- How to identify and treat some of the most common and destructive invasive plants in this area
- Pros and cons of different methods to remove invasive plants
- What methods can be used in late fall and over the winter

Rod and his wife, Maggie, are landowners in western Albemarle County who have been actively working with invasive plants on their own property. They have been instrumental in the formation of the Blue Ridge PRISM (Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management). The Blue Ridge PRISM seeks to reduce the negative impacts of invasive plants across ten counties of Virginia.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY



VIRGINIA RIDER TRAINING PROGRAM/BASIC RIDER COURSE (BRC)

This course coaches the student in fundamental motorcycle safety skills. It provides entry-level skills in safe riding strategies, effective turning, braking and obstacle avoidance; as well as understanding the risks involved in motorcycle riding. Students are required to have a valid Virginia drivers license. Successful completion of this course waives the DMV knowledge exam (learner's permit test) and the DMV road test. The successful student will receive a Virginia DMV Completion Certificate and Motorcycle Safety Foundation Completion Card. *This is valid in Virginia. Check your state requirements before enrolling.

Jump Start (JS) is designed for the novice to gain *familiarity and comfort* with a motorcycle before taking the Basic Rider Course (BRC). Learn a motorcycle's operational parts, how to mount & start it, practice clutch/throttle coordination, and how to make it stop and go! If you want to learn about motorcycles before taking the BRC, or just want some "hands-on" without taking a full course, this class is for you. Student should be able to balance and ride a bicycle before taking the Jump Start class and/or the BRC. \$10 discount on the BRC if taken after JS in the same season (call office to register). Limit of 3 students per class.

BASIC RIDER COURSE 2 (BRC2)

BRC2 provides current motorcyclists continuing opportunities for rider education and training. BRC2 is designed for riders with a minimum six months and 3,000 miles experience. Students provide their own street-legal motorcycles with proof of ownership (or written authorization to use bike in class), current license with "M" endorsement, proof of insurance, current state inspection, must pass a visual pre-ride safety inspection, and wear required riding gear. If these requirements are not met, student will not be able to participate and no refund or reschedule will be granted.

ROAD MAP TO TEEN LICENSURE

1. Apply for the learner's permit on or after the student is 15 years and 6 months of age or as soon as the parent feels the student is ready for such responsibility. To obtain the learner's permit at the DMV you will need the student's birth certificate and social security card. The student must complete an application, take an exam, vision test and pay the license fee. After obtaining the learner's permit, the student should stop by the driver education office at his/her school and pick up the **45-Hour Parent/Teen Driving Guide**. The handbook has practical tips for teaching the student how to drive, as well as a handy driving log to record supervised driving time. The DMV requires submission of a forty-five hour driving log when the student receives the temporary license (thirty hours of daylight driving and 15 hours of driving after sunset).
2. During the student's sophomore year, 36-hours of classroom driver education is provided in Health II. ***If the student is taking Virtual Health II, please contact the Community & Driver Education office at 434-975-9450 to learn about other options for completing the classroom driver education requirement.***
3. Once you have completed 15-20 hours of parent-supervised driving, schedule the student for In-Car driver training. Tuition is \$275 (subject to change). Per Virginia statute, students must have completed or at least begun the 36-hour classroom before beginning behind the wheel training, and ***may only take the classes concurrently at the same school.*** Additionally, Albemarle County Schools require parents to attend a 90-minute Parent Seminar (no charge) prior to enrolling their student in behind the wheel. In-Car Driver Education is offered in the morning from 6:30-8:30am and after school starting at 4pm throughout the school year, and during Study Hall hours subject to instructor availability. **To register for behind-the-wheel training, students must:**



- ◆ Possess their learner's permit;
- ◆ Have completed or at least started the 36 hour classroom (at the same school);
- ◆ Parent completes a 90 minute parent seminar;
- ◆ Pay the class fee in full or make a non-refundable \$50 deposit;
- ◆ Submit a completed registration form & parent permission form

4. Upon passing the road skills test given on the final day of behind the wheel instruction, the student is eligible to receive a temporary driver's license 9 months after the Learner's Permit Issuance date. The parent must come in with the student to sign the license and submit the driving log. This temporary license in combination with learner's permit allows the student to drive alone for 6 months, until the permanent license arrives, and is distributed at the local juvenile court. **To be eligible for the temporary license students must:**

- ⇒ Be 16 years and 3 months of age,
- ⇒ Have held learner's permit for nine months,
- ⇒ Have completed the 36 period classroom,
- ⇒ Have completed 45 hr. driving log (30 hrs. day & 15 hrs. night),
- ⇒ Passed the behind-the-wheel course.

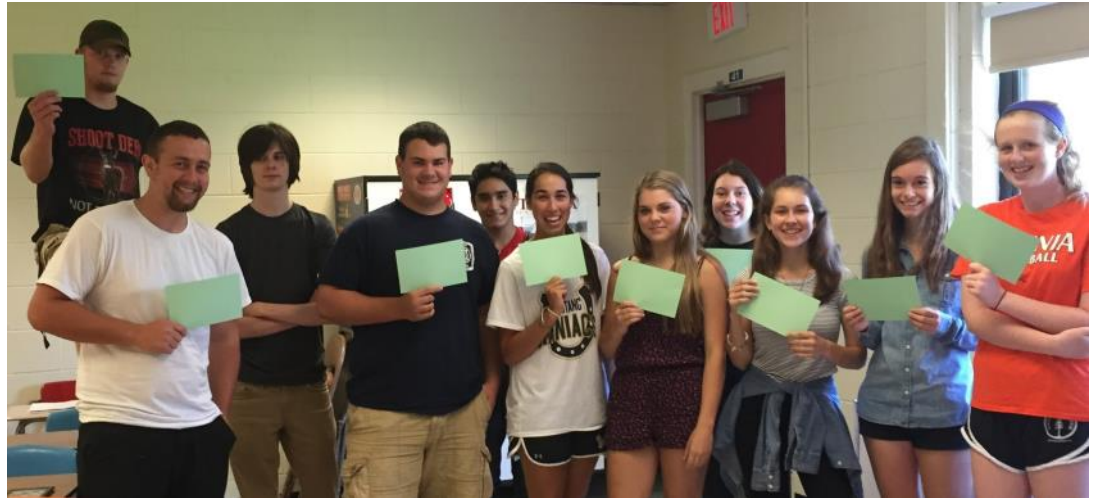

On November 18, 2021, the Virginia Board of Education received for first review the proposed revisions to the 2015 Driver Education Standards of Learning. The proposed 2022 Driver Education Standards of Learning for Virginia Public Schools have been refined through feedback from parents, teachers, administrators, and representatives from higher education, and define the skills and competencies necessary to become a proficient user of the highway transportation system. They focus on core concepts and procedures, set clear, concise and measurable expectations for novice drivers, and provide the framework for the Curriculum Guide for Driver Education in Virginia.

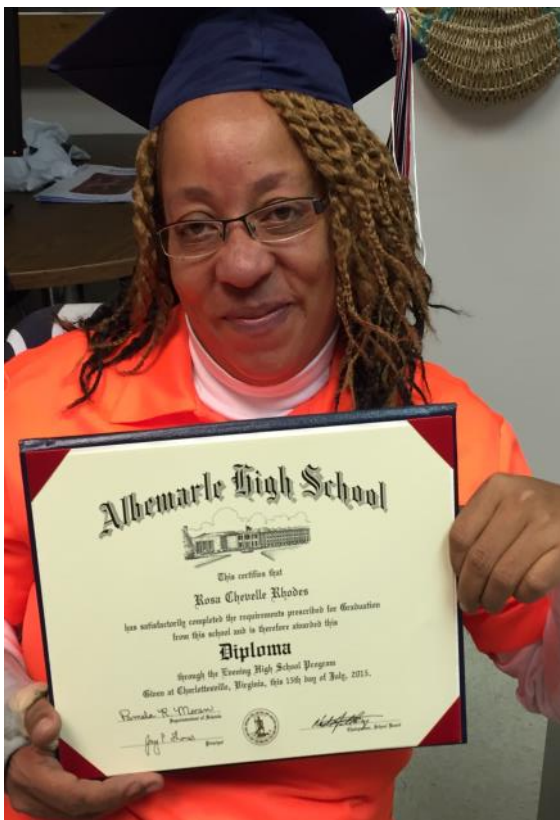
