The Taki Alsop Conducting Fellowship was in the spotlight at the inaugural Breaking Barriers Festival at Ravinia, in honor of its 20 years providing mentorship and intensive coaching with Alsop as well as financial support to aspiring female conductors.

More than two dozen women have been nurtured by the fellowship and are creating an equitable future for classical music through artistry and advocacy, many as music directors or chief conductors around the world. The Breaking Barriers Festival highlighted women on the podium whose work has broken barriers to inspire other women to pick up the baton — it was a weekend filled with music, symposia, films, and conversations.

Current fellow Anna Duczmal-Mróz and alumnae Laura Jackson and Jeri Lynne Johnson made their CSO debuts joining Marin Alsop on a program featuring Michael Daugherty's Time Machine for three conductors and CSO resident composer Jessie Montgomery's Source Code.

20th anniversary CONCERT SERIES

Following the triumphant kickoff of its 20th anniversary season at Chicago's Ravinia Festival with a three-concert series "Breaking Barriers: Women on the Podium," the Taki Alsop Conducting Fellowship (TACF) celebrates the anniversary year with a series of concerts around the globe.

The TACF is sponsoring a week of each of 10 orchestras led by their TACF-awarded Music Director and conductors during the 2022-23 seasons. TACF awardees will be on hand during these weeks to assist and benefit from the mentorship of their TACF predecessors.

All ten performances will feature Israeli-American cellist Inbal Segev – known for her "complete dedication and high intelligence" (San Francisco Classical Voice) – playing DANCE, a concerto commissioned by her from Grammy-nominated composer Anna Clyne.

Alexandra Arrieche (TACF, 2011) is the New Music Director of the Olympia Symphony Orchestra and the first woman music director for the organization.


The orchestra's leadership is as enthusiastic about their new music director as she is about her new position. "We were looking for somebody who had the right combination of qualities to help us grow," said Bill Tweit, president of the orchestra's board. "There's a certain electricity when Alex walks into the room — an excitement and electricity that we're looking forward to harnessing ourselves to," "She brings out the best in people," said Jennifer Hermann, the orchestra's executive director. "I heard so many people saying that after spending time with her, they felt better about themselves and about what they could contribute to our organization or community as a whole." The committee was impressed by Arrieche's rapport with young people, focus on educational programs and ideas about collaborations between the orchestra and other arts organizations, Barnes said.

"Alex was really curious and asked great questions," he added. That's really valuable in building relationships." Arrieche, who grew up in São Paulo, Brazil, has been living in Henderson, where she's led the orchestra since 2016. She'll continue leading that orchestra, and conducting the annual "Night Of The Proms" in Europe, as she takes up the baton in Olympia. "I will have my hub in Olympia," she said. "I really want to spend more time and get to know the community. That's how I work."

Arrieche's first Olympia concert will be a 2022-2023 season preview on Oct. 16 at the Kenneth J. Minnaert Center for the Arts. The concert will introduce audiences not only to the season's music but also to the new music director.

AUDITIONS

Getting that coveted audition does not include costs for travel, accommodation, and rides. One audition can cost a conductor \$2.000+.

ABOUT THE TAKI ALSOP CONDUCTING FELLOWSHIP

In 2002, Marin Alsop, with the financial support of Tomio Taki, created the Taki Alsop Conducting Fellowship to mentor, support, and promote women conductors as they advance in their professional careers. Over the past 19 years, the fellowship has provided intensive coaching, mentorship and financial support to female conductors. Today, all 30 conductors are working to ensure a more equitable future in classical music through their artistry and advocacy, and they hold 19 Music Directors/ Chief Conductor positions of orchestras around the world.
