### Tools

Journal and pencil for drawing Freezer paper #10 and 11 Straw needles #24 and #18 Chenille needles #3, #1 and #15 Milliners needles #24 and #20 Tapestry needles 60 wt. Efina cotton thread 12wt Ellana wool thread for wool appliqué Clover appliqué pins Bohin pencil glue stick Embroidery, paper and fabric scissors Circle template 1" x 6" ruler 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" ruler Small hexagon papers Helpful: personal light

### Background

For Mini Version - 20" square of hand dyed wool in a water color for your background Small pieces of cotton fabrics in the same color as the background wool for layering of your background If piecing a background in class a sewing machine is required.

#### Appliqué

Hand dyed wool in a variety of colors for appliqué design Assorted small pieces of textural fabrics including cotton, hand dyed silk velvet, silk and linen 1/4 yard Presto Sheer for stabilizing velvet

#### Embellishments

Embroidery and specialty threads in varying weights, fibers and textures. Some that I used include Eleganza, Razzle/Dazzle, Silk Ribbon, Aurora, Metallic Braid, Gimp, Nami Silk Thread, Fine Natural Dyed Thread, Petite Very Velvet, Angora, Plied Yarn, Silk Eyelash, Straw Silk, Silk & Ivory, Shinju Silk Pearl, Double Twisted Silk Gimp Couching yarns, ribbons, rick rack and beads, buttons and sequins
