

Collegiate Community Service on Behalf of REACH

On August 24 and 26th, two separate groups totaling sixty incoming freshmen from Brockport College and the University of Rochester removed tree debris and discarded trash from the western border of the property where REACH Advocacy, Inc. intends to establish a tiny home village. Advance preparation from REACH volunteers worked on chain-sawing toppled trees and clearing wild vegetation at the upper slope. The students then gathered the debris at the lower level and transported the materials to neatly organized piles for pick-up.



Extensive communication and collaboration with RG&E (Avangrid), Monroe County Pure Waters, City of Rochester, Brockport College, University of Rochester, Free Deliverance Church and REACH made the clean-up possible. The slope will be ready soon for a land survey required for property acquisition.



The combined activity built on the previous year's efforts to clear debris and demolition material from the flat upper level of the land parcel. Over the 2-year interval of this project more than 120 incoming college freshmen have assisted REACH at this location.
